

24-Hour Fall Protection Competent Person Course

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Benefits

OSHA requires that each worker who may be exposed to fall hazards from heights and uses fall protection equipment be trained by a Competent Person (29 CFR 1926 Subpart M). In addition to training by a Competent Person, EM 385-1-1 also requires contractors to develop a Site-Specific Fall Protection and Prevention Plan identifying the Competent Person and their responsibilities and qualifications. The 2014 edition of the EM 385-1-1 now requires a MINIMUM of 24 hours of documented training for the Fall Protection Competent Person. This course is designed to provide the basic knowledge needed through a combination of lectures, hands-on workshops, video presentations and in-depth group discussions. Course participants who successfully complete this course should have the knowledge to: identify the nature of fall hazards in the work area; the correct procedures for erecting, using, dismantling, maintaining, and storing fall protection equipment; the application limits, free fall distance, total fall distance and clearance requirements of fall protection systems and equipment; rescue equipment and procedures; and applicable fall protection regulations and guidelines.

Who Should Attend

Health & Safety Personnel, Site Safety and Health Officers (SSHOs), those with responsibilities as a Fall Protection Competent Persons, and anyone interested in gaining in-depth knowledge on fall protection.
