

For some kids, Saturday and Sunday are the longest days of the week.

As the *Volunteer Coordinator* for the Salina Emergency Aid Food Bank, I work with a lot of volunteers. Although volunteers who deliver the Food 4 Kids packs to the local schools in Salina only volunteer about one hour each week, the hour of service impacts the lives of many kids throughout our Salina community.

Food 4 Kids was established for students who are food insecure and are not getting sufficient food outside of school on a regular basis.

During the 2016-2017 school year, our volunteers delivered 8,240 packs to 10 schools in the Salina school district. Each pack is designed to provide nutrition and calories for chronically hungry school children on weekends.

The packs contain kid friendly foods that require no preparation

Foods that kids can just "open and eat" like the following:

- Peanut Butter (12-ounce jar) and a sleeve of crackers
- Beans and franks (pop-top can)
- Beef Jerky (1 ounce)
- Cereal (1-ounce bowl or box)
- Fruit cups (peaches, applesauce, etc)
- Raisins (snack-size boxes)
- Pudding cups
- Juice boxes (apple, orange, or other juice)
- Milk (aseptic pack boxes that do not require refrigeration)

Food Bank Facts

The Food Bank stocks over 55 different food items and over 25 different personal care items—— all made available by community donations.

Empty Bowls began in 1990 as an art class project in a Michigan high school to raise funds for a food drive. Students made ceramic bowls, served a meal of soup and bread, and invited guests to keep the bowl as a reminder of hunger in the world.
