Here is an update on this past month's happenings here at the Georgia Lions Camp.

It has been a really busy time of clean-up. With summer camp sessions behind us, we take these next few months to maintain, clean, repair, and improve the facilities here at the camp.

It is also a time of preparation for the upcoming Christmas Camp which will be the weekend of December 8-10, 2023. Campers are already asking when registrations will begin? Christmas Camp registrations are scheduled to begin October 28, 2023 and continue through November 28, 2023. Campers are encouraged to register by visiting the camps' website www.glcb.org and registering through our CampDoc link.

Over the past couple of months, the camp has been on the receiving end of some strong winds and a hurricane. Trees had fallen, limbs and debris was everywhere. Some damage to a few of our structures. A need for some help. Some of the damage will require a professional tree removal service.

October 6-8, 2023 was the camp's scheduled Lions Service Days here at the camp. Better known as work weekend. A time set aside for Lions and volunteers to come and help with cleaning and some repairs needed. Many of you tried to come but had some conflicting events scheduled. I do thank all of you for your continued support and look forward to seeing you here in the future.



As work projects were assigned to those who came, it was time to get busy. 1st Vice District Governor of N, who is a member of the Lyons Lions Club, Larry Griggers came ready to work. (pictured with the green shirt and big grin). Larry helped out with some clean up and painting.

Paul May, the camp's previous Board Chairman and a member of the Milledgeville Lions Club, (pictured in orange shirt) helped out with some much-needed pressure washing. Paul had commented, I just pressure washed the last time I was here. My reply was that there is always a need for pressure washing here at the camp. Always!!

Lions Jim Gertis and Howard Schulthorpe "District N" of the Jekyll Island Lions Club came on Friday and helped clean the railing at the playground. After cleaning it was painting time. Larry's assignment. He worked hard at this job.

Speaking of conflicting events schedules, Council Chair Mark Anners of the Bellville Lions Club called and asked if he could come a day earlier to help out here at the camp. Of course, work is available to be done on any given day. I did not get a picture of Mark but he cleaned up the damages done at the fishing dock. Caused by the fallen pine tree. This area needed cleaning because we have a group called Camp Hope who will be here with several young kids and they will be wanting to fish.



Also preparing for these kids to have a great event on Saturday, we wanted to make sure they had a safe



environment. Some of the damage to the fishing dock was some broken safety rails. Bill Owens who was once with the Monroe Lions Club helped install a few rails to make sure the kids did not walk off the deck while

fishing. These repairs are temporary and the entire roof and rails will need reconstructing at a later date.

Bill also helped replace the tin that was blown off one of the horse arena shelters. While his friend watched and took pictures of me taking pictures. Another job on the project list was replacing and repairing some

shower heads in the main dorm. Another project we can mark completed.

It was a beautiful weekend to work. Sunshine was pleasant, the temperatures

were a lot more bearable than the summer heat. On Sunday morning as you

stepped outside, you were greeted with temperatures that might have required you to wear long sleeves for a while. Once you started back to work, it did not take long to warm up.

This past summer two of our Lions from The East Cobb Lions Club helped repair the safety rails located at the emergency exits at the Dining Hall. They did not have time to paint them this past summer. So, both Mary Inman and Be'la Csepi came to help paint the

rails. They also painted the new guide rope post that had been installed.



With temperatures cooling down and not much need for the pool during the offseason preparations were underway so we can place the covering over the pool until it is needed next spring. Paul May clean the pool deck and chemicals are being added this week. Ready for winterization.

And if you notice in the background of the pool deck washing. There are two RV's who used our facilities here over the weekend. Their

great place to park. Lots of privacy, no dogs

barking, a feel safe environment, and a place where they could either hike or ride their bikes. Weather was so great they were able to fly their drone. Maybe they will share some pictures with us.

She starts at 6:00 am and finishes up late. Not only did she cook three meals, she cleaned the kitchen and serving areas. Rental groups are great. They

Once again attendance was a bit low but a lot was accomplished. Don't fret. There is still work to be done. Buildings will always need pressure washing. Windows and blinds can be cleaned. Weeds are waiting on you to pull them up.


Charles Williams is a member of the Douglas Lions Club in MD 18N.

Needs List 2023: updated 10/9/2023

Many have asked what does the camp need?

The following items will help eliminate the cost of supplies needed during camp season and beyond, maintenance and other operations of the camp.

- 1. There is a need for some pillows. Sometimes campers forget theirs and are needed here. Low-cost pillows from Walmart are sufficient. Nothing expensive. 20 pillows needed.
- 2. Bottle Water- 16oz. by the case Camp goes through 40 cases per year
- 3. PowerAde/Gatorade sports drinks- single serve bottles/24 to a case 10 cases needed

The lime and red are favorite flavors

- 4. 60-gallon industrial size garbage bags
- 5. Gallon size bleach- Five cases of 6 bottles per case (you do not have to buy all five cases needed)
- 6. Lysol dis-infectant spray- 2 cases of 6? cans per case
- 7. Laundry detergent- gallon size preferable- 3 cases of 6? Bottles per case
- 8. Windex window cleaner- 2 cases of 6 per case
- 9. Clorox disinfectant spray bottles 2 cases of 6 per case-(32 oz.)
- 10. Toilet Tissue any brand
- 11. Bug spray- non- DEET and DEET accepted. -20 cans spray or pump
- 12. Wasp Spray- Black Flag brand preferred. 2 cases of 12 per case.
- 13. Ant poison- here at the camp we have "ANT" issues, we need your help- bags of poison or industrial strength liquid needed. You can never ask for enough of this. All donations appreciated.
- 14. Copy paper for the office

All of the above items listed are used all through the year as needed.

"Gift Cards" are a great way for the camp to purchase other items that may not be on this list. (Movies, Board games, and other items for campers)

Items purchased can be shipped directly to the camp, (5626 Laura Walker Rd. Waycross, Ga. 31503) taken to, and distributed during our COG and Joint meetings with the Lions Camp and Lighthouse, the annual MD-18 Lions State Convention, bring items with you on our annual Lions Day event here at the camp, bring items when you come to work weekends.

Anyone can donate the above items. You don't have to be a Lions Club member.

"Please Note that, you are not asked to buy the amounts listed per item. Any purchase of a listed item is very much appreciated. If it's one item of something, a case, or several cases. Nothing is ever turned away."

Reciprocating Saw - electric or battery operated (20V) or Both

Drill bits- for wood and for masonry

Pressure Washer – needed for cleaning buildings

6'X10' utility trailer with gate that will let down to load equipment

Paint brushes – needed during work weekend tasks (30) these do not have to be expensive brushes

Pneumatic Staple Gun (there are usually combinations of three separate size staplers in one package deal)

Camp is in need of an air compressor
