2021 Ford Bronco

Specifications:

Engine - 2.3L EcoBoost or 2.7L EcoBoost

Transmission: 7-speed manual with crawler gear or 10-speed auto with Trail Control

Power: 300-hp (2.3L) and 330-hp with 415 lb-ft (2.7L)

Performance: 0-60 in 6.3 seconds (2.7L) (Car and Driver testing)

Base Price: \$29,995 to \$58,410 depending on trim level

The new Bronco is just now hitting showroom floors. With a bewildering 7 trim levels, two engine choices, and the ability to apply the "Sasquatch" off-road package to any of those levels, the Bronco buyer can't say they can't customize the Bronco to their liking! The Bronco is intended to go head to head with the Jeep Wrangler. With over 120,000 orders and counting, Ford appears to have a winner on its hands and Jeep should be worried. So far, Youtube reviewers seem to be loving the sophisticated road manners of the Bronco compared to the Wrangler, along with its prodigious off-road capabilities. Car and Driver says the Bronco is "surprisingly refined on the road, hugely capable off of it, more functional and practical than a Jeep Wrangler." The fact that all the doors come off and that the roof is available in a removable hardtop or folding soft top will make the Bronco a great summertime cruiser and get away vehicle. In my short drive with the base 2.3L and the manual, I found the manual to be slick and easy (dare I say "Honda like?") and the engine to be a little weak. Here's to a 5.0 as a future improvement, but until then, order up the 2.7L. I think the new Bronco is a winner!




