Brush, Grass, Weeds Accumulation of Trash

-Generally, no owner or occupant of any real property located within the Village of Interlaken shall allow such real property to become overgrown with brush, grass or weeds, six inches or higher, or allow the unlawful accumulation on such property of rubbish or trash.

-Duty of owner or occupant. It shall be the duty of the owner or occupant of any real property located within the Village of Interlaken to cut, trim and remove any such brush, grass or weeds thereon and to remove from such real property any accumulation of rubbish or trash thereon.
