MODERATOR'S REPORT

Pastor Leanne provided Session with a calendar of events for the remaining months of 2024.

There will be a congregational meeting on September 22 after worship service to elect the Class of 2026 Elders and Deacons. Elder and Deacon training will be scheduled when most officers are able to attend as determined by a poll with potential dates. Installation will be October 27.

COMMITTEE REPORTS

Administrative and Personnel—Preparing budget with a 4% raise for staff.

Hospitality—Will check with Papa's Pumpkin Patch for a date.

Proclamation—Christian Education—PAC and Presbyteens begin September 11. Third-graders receive Bibles on September 15. There will be a fall treat sponsored by the Fargo FPC. Once there is a design created, t-shirts will be ordered.

Proclamation—Worship and Music—November 24 will be the St. Andrew's Day celebration with Mandan and Glencoe churches invited to participate.

Property and Equipment—Session approved the use of \$6,080 from the parking lot fund to repair asphalt in the west lot.

Resource Management—Stewardship drive begins September 22 and concludes with Consecration Sunday October 13 with a catered lunch.

Child Care Center Board—Staffing issues remain. Staff recognition including the CCC will be September 29.
