Winter Minestrone



Directions:

1. Heat the oil in a heavy large pot over medium heat. Add the onion, carrots, celery, pancetta, and garlic. Sauté until the onion is translucent, about 10 minutes. Add the Swiss chard and potato; sauté for 2 minutes. Add the tomatoes and rosemary sprig. Simmer until the chard is wilted and the tomatoes break down, about 10 minutes.

2 carrots, peeled, chopped 2 celery stalks, chopped 3 ounces thinly sliced pancetta, coarsely chopped 2 garlic cloves, minced 1 pound Swiss chard, stems trimmed, leaves coarsely chopped 1 russet potato, peeled, cubed 1 (14 1/2-ounce) can diced tomatoes 1 fresh rosemary sprig 1 (15-ounce) can cannellini beans, drained, rinsed 2 (14-ounce) cans low-sodium beef broth 1 ounce piece Parmesan cheese rind 2 tablespoons chopped fresh Italian parsley leaves Salt and pepper

2. Meanwhile, blend 3/4 cup of the beans with 1/4 cup of the broth in a processor until almost smooth. Add the pureed bean mixture, remaining broth, and Parmesan cheese rind to the vegetable mixture. Simmer until the potato pieces are tender, stirring occasionally, about 15 minutes. Stir in the whole beans and parsley. Simmer until the beans are heated through and the soup is thick, about 2 minutes. Season with salt and pepper, to taste. Discard Parmesan rind and rosemary sprig (the leaves will have fallen off of the stem.)

The group then walked around the neighborhood with the officers while they answered questions and showed the residents how landscaping, security lights, and cameras can curb neighborhood crime.



Neighborhood Watch Program

The Neighborhood Watch Program (NWP) is aimed at preventing crime, as well as making your home, family and neighborhood safer. NWP is a partnership between the DPD and the communities it serves. NWP encourages completing a home inventory and marking your valuables and other high-risk items. Taking these steps can increase your chance of recovering your property, or the value of that property, in the event of a theft or loss. NWP means neighbors watching out for each other by reporting suspicious persons, vehicles and activities to the DPD. When your block participates in the NWP, the City will install a Neighborhood Watch sign to warn criminals, and encourage newcomers that your neighborhood is organized against crime, and residents are looking out for each other.
