Standard VI: Professional Responsibilities and Collaboration

Teachers demonstrate professional responsibility and engage relevant stakeholders to maximize student growth, development, and learning. This can be accomplished by...

- -upholding professional standards of practice and policy as related to students' rights and teachers' responsibilities
- -Engaging and collaborating with colleagues and the community to develop and sustain a common culture that supports high expectations for student learning
- -Communicating and collaborating with families, guardians, and caregivers to enhance student development and success
- -Managing and performing noninstructional duties in accordance with school district guidelines or other applicable expectations
- -understanding and complying with relevant laws and policies as related to students' rights and teachers' responsibilities

Practical Special Education Strategies That Benefit ALL Students

- -Use checklists to help students get organized
- -Modify expectations based on individual student needs
- -Break assignments into segments of shorter tasks
- -Provide a model of the end product
- -Provide written and visual explanations with visuals if possible
- -Provide outlines, study guides and copies of notes
- -Provide reinforcers and feedback

10 Effective Study Strategies to Boost Learning (John Dunlosky)

- 1. Practice Testing: Self-testing or taking practice tests on to-belearned material
- 2. Distributed Practice: Implementing a schedule of practice that spreads out study activities over time
- 3. Interleaved Practice:
 Implementing a schedule of
 practice that mixes different
 types of materials within a
 single study session
- 4. Elaborative Interrogation: Generating an explanation for why a stated fact or concept is true
- 5. Self-explanation: Explaining how new information relates to known information, or explaining steps when problem solving

- 6. Rereading text material
- 7. Highlighting and underlining potentially important material
- 8. Writing summaries (of various lengths) of to-be-learned text
- Keyword Mnemonic: Using keywords and mental imagery to associate verbal materials
- 10. Imagery for text:
 Attempting to form mental
 images of text materials while
 reading or listening



Tips for Using the Effective Study Strategies

- *Give a low-stakes quiz at the beginning of each class or unit and focus on the most important material
- *Give a cumulative exam, which should encourage students to re-study the most important material
- *Encourage students to use a "study planner", so they can distribute their study over time and rely less on cramming
- *Encourage students to practice retrieval when studying instead of passively reading their books and notes
- *Encourage students to elaborate on what they are reading by asking "why" questions
- *Mix it up in math class: Include problems from previous units when creating practice problems
