Let's meet The Rev. Darian L. Hybl



On July 9, 2017, Emmanuel Lutheran Church, Export, PA voted to extend the divine call to Pastor Darian L. Hybl. Pastor Hybl then served Emmanuel Lutheran Church, Goodland, KS, where he had served since 2010.

A graduate of Longwood (College) University, Farmville, VA in 1991 with a BS in Professional Chemistry and a minor in Biology. Darian then attended and graduated from Western Carolina University in 1996 with a MS in Chemistry concentrating in Analytical Chemistry, specifically Computer Control and Fluorescence of B-Vitamins.

In 1993 Darian began attending Concordia Lutheran Theological Seminary, St. Catharines, ON, Canada while living in Youngstown then Niagara Falls (Bergholz), NY. He completed his studies at Lutheran Theological Southern Seminary, Columbia, SC. During 1997-1998, Darian served his vicarage under the care of Pastor John Paul Lingle at St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Dallas, NC. After 'successful' completion of his vicarage and graduation requirements, Darian continued his studies toward a STM and graduated with an M.Div. in May 1999 along with completing two units of Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE).

Darian served a small church in Dagus Mines, PA, before marrying Michele (Hope) in December 1999. They then made their home in Virginia and he taught Chemistry, Religion, Ethics and other classes for numerous community colleges in both North Carolina and Virginia until his call to Emmanuel Lutheran, Goodland, KS where he was ordained and installed on October 23, 2010. In September 2010, Darian was accepted onto the roster of the Lutheran Congregations in Mission for Christ.

Pastor Darian was interviewed by Pastor David Wendel and accepted onto the roster of the North American Lutheran Church in January 2012.

Pastor Hybl and Michele have one daughter, Sarah who is in 4th Grade in the Franklin Regional School System. She enjoys Pokemon, dancing and building with Lego's.

They make their home in White Valley and enjoy family time, watching movies and visiting the new and exciting museums that the Pittsburgh area has to offer.

When the Nile congregation voted to join the North American Lutheran Church, that church mandated that they leave. In the seven plus years, the Nile Lutheran Church has been renting space in different places throughout the Rochester, New York area. A few years ago, they stepped out in faith and purchased a building that might one day be their home. After a few years of renovation, with much prayer, patience and with many donations, Nile has begun to worship in their new home.

The Nile congregation expresses its deepest thanks and appreciation to the Mission District Deans who have helped them through this process, for the congregations who have kept them in prayer and provided financial assistance.

St. Paul (Trauger, PA) was the first congregation of the NALC to formally partner with Nile. Over the years we have visited each other, shared in Bible studies, conversations and prayer.
