Are You At Your Limit? - Keeping Things Where They Need To Be.

You need to consider the fact that our Model A's have now been on the road for no less than 86 years and as long as 90. The number of repairs and owners of these cars have been many. A visit to today's Ford dealership would certainly be of no help to fix your car but only a day brightener for those pulling wrenches in the shop. So, it is up to those with experience and those of us today who have figured out how to keep them on the road to share our common experiences. There are always new Model A owners that can use your help so any tips or lessons learned should be shared. If you have something to share please contact your newsletter editor and let's get something in print.

On the later style steering column known as the two-tooth steering it is extremely important that the column when placed in the car be correctly oriented. If it is not your distributor cannot have its full range of motion which will affect proper timing not allowing the engine to perform as it was designed. The slot in the upper distributor housing has a fixed range which limits the travel of the advance and retard of engine timing. Should the column when replaced if not have being clocked to the correct position you will not have the ability to use the entire length of the slot travel. Go to your spark advance lever in the car and place it to the top of the travel, then look at the distributor slot to see if it is at one of the limits. Next move the lever all the way down and make sure it is at the other limit. Should it be short on either travel side examine the rod connecting the upper plate of the distributor to the column. It could be bent or of the wrong length. If it looks fine next make sure the slot in the distributor body is of the correct length. There have been bad repro distributor parts. Your spark advance lever should move thru its entire range. Should you need to make an adjustment you now just loosen the nut - (Picture A) and rotate the column either way, using the spark advance lever in the up and down position to find the correct orientation. Then re tighten the bolt. Now you should check your timing going thru the timing procedure. If you were not getting full travel before this after resetting the full amount of travel in the distributer slot you should have easier starting and a better running engine. Another common problem also related to full length of travel is to make sure when you fully press the accelerator pedal to the floor the full travel of the linkage allows for the full travel to bottom out on the carburetor casting stop (Picture B). First check to see if the linkage rod is bent or maybe there is a floor board or carpet issue limiting the travel of the pedal. If these check out OK the next thing to do to fix this the problem, you can gently cold bend the accelerator linkage to make up the difference. Over the years this part could have gotten bent and there were a number of versions of these made thru production that perhaps have a slightly different throw that limits the full potential of the carburetor fuel supply. This problem is regularly found and owners are surprised of the additional road speed that they gain after the fix. On most of the production runs of the accelerator linkage there are two spots (Picture C) on the assembly that are supposed to receive a few drops of oil to keep things moving freely.
