## MAE McBRIDE KURTZ

1895 - 1988

Mae McBride Kurtz, age 92, former Elkton business woman, died Sunday afternoon, May 15 at the Huron Medical Care Facility near Bad Axe.

She was born June 14, 1895 in Standish, daughter of the late Louis and Celina (Mominey) LaForge. On June 16, 1914, she was united in marriage to Robert J. McBride in Detroit.
