What makes Christians different and what makes Christianity distinct from any other religion? It is grace: treating others, not as they deserve, but as God wishes them to be treated...with love, kindness and mercy. God is good to the unjust as well as the just. His love embraces saints and sinners alike. God seeks our highest good and teaches us to seek the greatest good of others, even those who hate and abuse us. and selfish towards us, must be marked by the same kindness and mercy which God has shown to us. It is easier to show kindness and mercy when we can expect to benefit from doing so. How much harder when we can expect nothing in return!

How can we possibly love those who cause us harm or ill-will? With God all things are possible. He gives power and grace to those who believe in and accept the gift of the Holy Spirit. His love conquers all, even our hurts, fears, prejudices and griefs. Only the cross of Jesus Christ can free us from the tyranny of malice, hatred, revenge, and resentment and gives us the courage to return evil with good. Such love and grace have power to heal and to save from destruction. Do we know the power of God's love, mercy, and righteousness for overcoming evil with good? Let us pray today: Lord Jesus, your love brings freedom and pardon. Fill me with your Holy Spirit and set my heart free with your merciful love that nothing may make me lose my temper, disturb my peace, take away my joy, nor make me bitter towards anyone.

# Saint of the Week: St. Polycarp, Bishop of Smyrna

Polycarp, bishop of Smyrna in what is now western Turkey, was a disciple of Saint John the Apostle and a friend of Saint Ignatius of Antioch. He was a highly revered Christian leader during the first half of the second century.

Saint Ignatius, on his way to Rome to be martyred, visited Polycarp at Smyrna, and later wrote him a personal letter. The Asia Minor churches recognized Polycarp's leadership by choosing him as a representative to discuss with Pope Anicetus the date of the Easter celebration in Rome—a major controversy in the early Church.

At age 86, Polycarp was led into the crowded Smyrna stadium to be burned alive. The flames did not harm him and he was finally killed by a dagger. The centurion ordered the saint's body burned. The "Acts" of Polycarp's martyrdom are the earliest preserved and fully reliable account of a Christian martyr's death. He died in 155. St. Polycarp is the patron saint of relief from earaches.

Fast from pressures and be prayerful.


Fast from bitterness and fill your heart with joy.
