STUBLER RETURNS TO WINNER'S CIRCLE FOR 2nd TITLE

PALMER DOMINANT IN WINNING FOR 4th TIME

STUBLER CAPTURES TOUR VICTORY # 2

Nate Stubler grabbed one of the most impressive victories of his career at this season's Tournament of Champions, returning to the GISBT Winner's Circle for the 2nd time in his career. He previously won his first event at the December 2017 tour stop in Waterloo, Iowa. At this season's finale, Stubler turned in one of the most impressive Tournament of Champions performances in tour history.

Stubler, a 20 year-old lefty from LaSalle, Illinois, has made a spectacular mark on the GISBT. In just 9 tour appearances, he's qualified for the match play finals 6 times, and has now won \$1,760 in scholarships.

CHAMPION GOES UNDEFEATED IN MATCH PLAY

After qualifying in 6th at +162, Stubler turned up the afterburners once match play began. The talented southpaw averaged a whopping 251.87 for his 8 matches – and rolling through match play with an unblemished 8-0 record. As the finals rolled on, the eventual champ continued to crank out big game after big game, and opening up his lead along the way; his eventual margin of victory was 238 pins!

Stubler capped off a fantastic season in which he bowled his way onto 2019 Junior Team USA at the annual Team USA Trials in Las Vegas this past January.

For his 16 games Stubler averaged 236.06. He took home a \$500 scholarship, as well as the championship plaque for his victory. Congratulations, Nate!

TALENTED FIELD OF 36 COMPETES IN GRAND FINALE

An incredibly talented starting field of 36 players (24 boys and 12 girls) were introduced in opening ceremonies. Among this year's Tournament of Champions field were 17 past GISBT champions who had combined their talents for 50 GISBT victories, and 317 match play finals appearances and more than \$71,000 in scholarship earnings. That made this year's T of C field one of the deepest fields in tour history.

WIEGAND MATCHES BEST EFFORT ON TOUR, SNARES RUNNER-UP FINISH

Ray Wiegand was in great form again this month. The 2-hander from Marshalltown, Iowa equaled his finest effort on tour – a runner-up finish that netted him a \$350 payday. Earlier this season, Wiegand rolled to a runner-up finish at the October event in Waterloo. This month, the 18 year-old closed with an important 247 game in the position round that enabled him to move into the runner-up position. Wiegand was appearing in his 10th match play finals appearance.

PLAYER OF THE YEAR MARTIN II PLACES 3rd

Sean Martin put the finishing touches on an outstanding GISBT season. The stocky 2-hander from Dayton, Ohio finished 3rd at this season's finale. Martin, who was presented with the 2018-2019 GISBT Bowler of the Year Award in opening ceremonies, won a \$225 scholarship for his efforts. In 10 events on tour this season, he placed among the top 5 finishers 8 times.

9-TIME CHAMP DODGE EARNS 4th IN FINAL TOUR APPEARANCE

Anthony Dodge, 22, completed one of the great careers in tour history at this season's Tournament of Champions. The 9-time tour champion used a heroic 280 in his final qualifying game to catapult him into the match play finals for the 30th time in his tour career. His 4th place finish netted him a \$200 payday, which pushed his career earnings on tour to \$8,420.

The southpaw from North Bend, Nebraska was appearing in the 43rd and final tour stop of his illustrious career. Dodge, a 2-time GISBT Bowler of the Year, amassed a sensational record of 30 match play appearances, and a career average of 225.04 for his 582 games bowled.

BOHO FINISHES 5th

Brent Boho finished 5th at this month's event. The 21 year-old was one of three 2-handers in this month's boy's finals field. Boho surged from 7th place into 5th place thanks to a 241 position round effort; he took home a \$175 scholarship for his efforts. The powerful player from Colgate, Wisconsin, was appearing in his 10th match play finals round.

MINER TAKES 6th

Jayson Miner, 19, appearing in the 5th match play finals of his career, was this month's 6th place finisher. The lanky right-hander from Silvis, Illinois took home a \$150 scholarship for his performance.

WEAVER FINISHES 7th IN FINALS DEBUT

Dale Weaver enjoyed a breakthrough performance at this season's Tournament of Champions. The 17 year-old from Cedar Rapids, Iowa qualified for his first-ever match play finals, and in the end, he would go on to finish in 7th place. He took home a \$130 scholarship for his day's work.

2-TIME WINNER HIBBARD TAKES 8th

Billy Hibbard, a 2-time GISBT champion, rounded out this month's boy's finalists; he finished 8th, capturing a \$125 scholarship. The 21 year-old from Mukwonago, Wisconsin, was one of 4 past tour champions in the finals field. He was appearing in the 16th match play finals of his career.

**BAILEY PUTS FORTH DOMINANT EFFORT TO CAPTURE T OF C TITLE
GARNERS 4th CAREER TOUR CROWN**

PALMER PREVAILS FOR 4th GISBT TITLE

In the annals of the Greater Iowa Scholarship Bowling Tour, there have been many impressive performances. This month, Bailey Palmer stamped her name alongside some of the most memorable by putting on a clinic. The talented right-hander from Ottumwa, Iowa struck early and often, and claimed the biggest prize of her tour career by hauling in the 2019 Tournament of Champions title.

Palmer averaged 233.50 for her 8-game qualifying round, which enabled her to grab a commanding 172-pin lead heading into match play. There, she continued her fine form, averaging 224.66 for her 6 games, winning 5 times, and losing only in the position round. The result was a dominant 212-pin victory.

Palmer capped her 2017-2018 campaign by winning 3 consecutive events, but had been winless since that streak. This month, she was a determined champion, as evidenced by her dominating victory. For Palmer, this month represented her 23rd match play round appearance.

She took home the championship plaque and a \$350 scholarship. That boosted her career earnings on tour past the \$4,000 mark; she's now earned \$4,302 on tour. For her 14 games, she averaged 229.71. Congratulations, Bailey!

MOORE TAKES RUNNER-UP IN BEST FINISH OF CAREER

At 14, Rachel Moore was the youngest competitor to qualify for this season's Tournament of Champions. In opening ceremonies, Rachel Moore was presented with the 2018-2019 Rising Star Award; it is presented annually to a young up-and-coming player on tour. Well; it didn't take long for the slender right-hander from Keokuk, Iowa, to justify that award, as she grabbed runner-up honors at the year-end event.

She rebounded from a sluggish start in qualifying to grab the #5 seed heading into match play. Once the finals began, Moore easily did some of the best bowling of her young career by averaging 234.83 for the finals. She posted a 5-1 ledger along the way. This was easily the highest match play total among the 6 finalists, and it enabled her to charge from 5th place into the runner-up spot. Earlier this season, Moore finished 3rd at the Muscatine tour stop this past November, but this represented her highest finish on tour. She carted home a \$225 scholarship for her performance.

DEFENDING CHAMP KELLY TAKES 3rd

A year ago, Michaela Kelly used the Tournament of Champions stage to post her first career victory. This season, the slender righty from Bettendorf, Iowa added 2 more wins to her impressive career resume, and closed the books on her GISBT career with a 3rd place showing.

Over the past 5 seasons, Kelly became one of the tour's finest shotmakers, and that led the 22-year old to 20 match play finals appearances. She took home a \$175 scholarship for her finish.

DUVER, COMPETING IN 75th GISBT, EARNS 4th

Hanna Duver was this month's 4th place finisher; she won a \$150 scholarship for her efforts. Duver hit some noteworthy milestones at this year's T of C. The 19 year-old from Indianola, Iowa was appearing in her 75th tour event – becoming one of just a half-dozen competitors to reach that lofty landmark. Her \$150 payday also enabled her to push her career earnings on tour past the \$5,000 mark; she's now earned \$5,095 in GISBT competition. This month marked her 29th match play finals appearance.

PETERS PLACES 5TH

Jackie Peters closed out her career in style by finishing 5th. The hard-throwing right-hander from Elk Grove Village, Illinois hauled in a \$130 scholarship in the process. Peters ended the season by advancing to 3 match play finals in her final 4 events.

2-TIME CHAMP HESS WINDS UP 6th

Megan Hess rounded out the girl's finals field this month by finishing 6th. The right-hander from Urbandale, Iowa enjoyed a breakthrough season on tour by winning a pair of titles and making her first GISBT All Star Team appearance. Hess, 19, earned a \$125 scholarship for her performance.

DUVER BECOMES JUST 6th PLAYER IN TOUR HISTORY

TO COMPETE IN 75 EVENTS

Hanna Duver past a noteworthy milestone in her career at this season's Tournament of Champions. She became just the 6th competitor to reach that landmark in the 27-season history of the GISBT. She has 3 years of GISBT eligibility remaining, so there's no doubt she's going to set some monumental records before her career comes to a close. Ironically; she is chasing her older brother Mitchell, who ended his career at last year's Tournament of Champions, and is the all-time events bowled leader on tour with 79.

There have only been a total of 11 players to reach the 70-tournament plateau, with 3 of those reaching that pinnacle this season. Besides Duver, who hit the 70 mark at the November event, Alex Denton finishes his career with 74 tournaments bowled, and Kayla Crawford closed out her career with 71 tournaments bowled.

TRIBUTE PAID TO 10 DEPARTING TOUR MEMBERS

In opening ceremonies at this year's Tournament of Champions, tributes paid to 10 GISBT veterans who had competed in more than 450 tournaments, with 23 tour wins, 130 match play finals, and more than \$30,000 in tour earnings. This represented one of the largest groups of departing members in the 27-season history of the GISBT.

Among the 10 departing members were several of the tour's all-time great performances. Kayla Crawford ended her career with 71 tour appearances, 8 victories as well as 39 match play finals and more than \$7,800 in tour earnings. She also captured this season's Bowler of the Year Award, and was a 6-time GISBT All Star.

Anthony Dodge leaves behind a legacy that includes 43 events bowled, with 30 match play finals and 9 tour victories, and more than \$8,000 in earnings. He was also a 2-time GISBT Bowler of the Year, and a 4-time GISBT All Star.

Michaela Kelly, a 3-time champion, finished her career as a 20-time match play finalist, with 3 tour titles and more than \$3,500 in earnings. She was also a 3-time GISBT All Star.

Braxton Coble captured his first tour win earlier this season, and leaves his mark as a 13-time finalist with more than \$3,000 in tour earnings and 49 events bowled.
