

### Pantry Items

Please let Roy Stephenson know if you know of someone who has a need. Please check the expiration dates of food items for a long shelflife for it may be awhile before an item is donated, but if you know of a specific need please let us know. If the item is close to expiring Lula will



pull them off the shelves and Rov will take them to the homeless shelter, if no family, individual or special requests have been made. NOTE: Our pantry is small, so we try not to over stock and we don't have anyone to check the pantry daily or give out items. Currently, we are running low on pasta, e.g. spaghetti, Mac & Cheese and cereal, boxes of milk with long shelf life e.g. Parmalat, rice milk, etc.

PLEASE NO PERISHABLE ITEMS, e.g. loaves of bread or baked goods because they increase the potential for bugs, and they lose their freshness within a short time span.
