Because God is glorified by the exalted role in salvation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, her name is one of honour, a holy name, a maternal name, and a name responsive to the needs of the Church.

Adopted by the Church in Rome during the seventh century, the feast commemorates both the dedication of the original Church of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem in 335 and Christ's victory over death.
Weekday Masses are celebrated usually at 10 a.m. Please check the schedule in the bulletin.		<u>September 15 - Memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows:</u> Formerly known as the 'Seven Sorrows of Mary', this feast was instituted in 1668 by the Servite Friars out of their devotion to Mary. The seven sorrows are: <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Simeon's prophecy at the presentation of Jesus in the temple, 2. The flight into Egypt, 3. The disappearance of the boy Jesus in Jerusalem, 4. The road to Calvary, 5. The crucifixion, 6. The removal of Jesus from the Cross, 7. The entombment of Jesus.
