n todav's Gospel. Jesus is teaching us that L we should be concerned about the quality of life within our Church community. This quality of life is reflected by our life of love - love of God and love of neighbour. We are all connected to each other, and what we do affects the rest. We are called, therefore, to always work for the fulfilment of all, through love. As one family in



Christ, and not just individuals in Church, we need to be open to one another, to face up to tensions and misunderstandings, and to mend bridges. The life of the Christian community is one of the most important ways in which the Gospel is proclaimed. Reaching out to one another in love will result in the quality of life desired by the Lord Jesus. It is, in the end, this quality of life which will commend the Gospel of the love of God to others outside the community.

September 12 - Memorial of The Most Holy Name of Mary: This feast honouring the name of Mary was instituted by Pope Innocent XI in the seventeenth century. Because God is glorified by the exalted role in salvation of the Blessed Virgin Mary, her name is one of honour, a holy name, a maternal name, and a name responsive to the needs of the Church.

September 14 - Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross: This liturgical feast has been celebrated since early times. Adopted by the Church in Rome during the seventh century, the feast commemorates both the dedication of the original Church of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem in 335 and Christ's victory over death.

<u>September 15 - Memorial of Our Lady of Sorrows:</u> Formerly known as the 'Seven Sorrows of Mary', this feast was instituted in 1668 by the Servite Friars out of their devotion to Mary. The seven sorrows are:

1. Simeon's prophecy at the presentation of Jesus in the temple.

- The flight into Eqypt, 2.
- The disappearance of the boy Jesus in Jerusalem, 3.
- 4. The road to Calvary,
- 5. The crucifixion.
- The removal of Jesus from the Cross, 6.
- 7. The entombment of Jesus.


