PUBLIC HEARING, OCTOBER 8, 6:30 P.M.:

The Town Board has called a public hearing on October 8, 2020 starting at 6:30 p.m. to hear public comments on Ordinance 8.04 Minimum Lot Size. The Town Board is considering changing the lot size (to 1-2 acres) and the public road frontage (to 100 feet) amounts in Section 4. Attached is the full ordinance. 8.04 Minimum Lot Size.

[1] Preamble.

It is in the best interests of the Town of Maple Creek to establish a minimum lot size to regulate and restrict population distribution and density, lessen congestion, promote safety of its citizens, stabilize and protect property values, and further appropriate use of land and conservation of natural resources, including the Town's valuable farmland.

[2] Application of Ordinance.

This ordinance shall apply to all structures and land within the unincorporated areas of the Town of Maple Creek, Outagamie County, Wisconsin.

[3] Compliance, Violations and Penalties.

[a] The provisions of this ordinance shall be enforced by or under the direction of the Town Board Supervisors. Any person, firm or corporation who violated, disobeys, neglects, omits or refuses to comply with, or who resists the enforcement of any of the provisions of this ordinance shall, upon conviction, forfeit not less than \$10.00 nor more than \$500.00 for each offense, together with the costs of prosecution, shall be imprisoned until said forfeiture and costs are paid, but not to exceed thirty (30) days for each violation. Each day that a violation continues to exist shall constitute a separate offense. Compliance herewith may also be enforced by in junctional order at the suit of the township or the owner or owners of real estate within the district affected by the regulations of this ordinance. [b] No structure on land shall hereafter be used and no structure or part thereof shall hereafter be located, erected, moved,

reconstructed, extended, enlarged, converted or structurally altered without a building permit, and without full compliance with the provisions of this ordinance and all other applicable local, county and state regulations.

[4] Lot Requirements.

All lots created for residential use shall have a minimum lot size of two (2) acres and a minimum public road frontage of 295 feet. No land included in any street, highway or railroad right-of-way shall be included in computing lot area. A certified survey map shall be filed with the building inspector prior to issuance of any residential building permit so that this restriction may be properly enforced.

Deadlines:

Oct 14th-Deadline for electors to register by mail or on-line to vote in the General Election. After this date, electors must register in person in the clerk's office or at the polling place.

Oct 20th-First day to issue absentee ballots in clerk's office

Oct 29th-Deadline (5pm) for regular and overseas electors to request absentee ballots by mail (online, email or fax) for the General Election.

Oct 30th-Deadline (5pm) for electors to register to vote in the clerk's office

You can request an absentee ballot, register, find out what's on the ballot, or get the clerk's information, etc., online at <u>https://myvote.wi.gov</u>. **Covid-19 Preparations Election Day:** The same Covid-19 preparations will be activated for the next two Elections; social distancing, etc. The machines, counters, bathrooms, door knobs, etc. will be disinfected regularly. Everyone will receive their own pen for signing the poll book. Wear a facemask if you are sick.

The meeting was to discuss the second culvert on Kickhaefer that was also in very bad shape. The County was going to be on the road to replace the east end culvert. *Bruette made a motion, seconded by Korth, to replace a 30 inch culvert at the west end*
