
Making a difference in others' lives

Recently I read a short story about a little girl and a dying starfish. She was walking along a beach covered with thousands of starfish left dying by the receding tide. Seeking to help, she started picking up the dying starfish and tossing them back into the ocean. A man, who watched her with amusement, said, "Little girl, there are hundreds of starfish on the beach. You cannot make a difference by putting a few of them back into the sea." Discouraged, she began to walk away. Suddenly, she turned around, picked up another starfish, and tossed it into the sea. Turning to the man, she smiled and said, "At least I made a difference to that one!" The Gospel of Saint Luke tells us about another girl, Mary, who dares to make a difference. She is just a village girl. After receiving the great news from the Angel Gabriel, carrying baby Jesus in her womb, paid a visit to her cousin Elizabeth. Elizabeth was not only old but also six months pregnant. Being pregnant at that age is not easy. Elizabeth's life, I believe, was incredibly difficult. Mary's visit and help was a blessing. She made a difference in the lives of her cousin Elizabeth and of her unborn child, John. When John had grown up, he helped Mary's Son to transform the history of mankind by preparing the way for the Messiah.

The story of the little girl and Mary, Mother of Jesus, are truly inspiring. Both encourage us to make a difference in others' lives. Both convince us that the work we do or service we offer, no matter how unimportant or small, can benefit others. Moreover, both Mary and the little girl, teach us to take the first step. Even when the problem seems hopeless it can be solved by taking the first step.

As we are approaching the Christmas celebration let us focus not only on ourselves but also open our eyes to see the need of people around us. As a result of the Covid-19 pandemic, for instance, which has devastated the lives of many in the past two years, and other problems, many are like Elizabeth and dying starfish. Like Elizabeth, mother of John, they need our love, care, and also financial and material help to be able to experience the joy of Christmas. Many are going through life like dying starfish. The receding tide of life has thrown their lives (like refugees), marriages, family, health, and so on, out of the ocean of joy. Let us keep in mind that you and I are like Mary and the little girl called to help the least fortunate, marginalized, sick, isolated brothers and sisters to show them how much God loves and cares for them. Let us all be the real presence of the One born in Betlehem to others.


