FALLEN TREES OR LIMBS

With the frequency of storms and high winds a tree or limb may fall on your property. Here are some guidelines for care and management. It is the responsibility of the property owner to maintain any tree on their property. You may be responsible for your dead or diseased trees that fall onto other properties. If branches from a neighbor's tree are hanging over your property you may trim tree limbs hanging over your property. The good neighbor approach is to let the tree owner know. If your neighbor's tree falls onto your property damaging anything on your property (house, car, fence etc.), check with your homeowners insurance as to responsibility for the damages. The Shade Tree Commission has recommended a few reliable and trustworthy arborists in the area. Please see our website or Facebook page for the list. Here you can also find information on how to handle certain diseases affecting our trees such as Hemlock Wooly Adelgid.

PARK NEWS

First and foremost: the CH Civic Association did receive the \$50,000 in Stimulus Funds in early March! This was federal money distributed by the Penn Hills municipality.

The CHCA has decided to use this money to improve the sports court on Sycamore Drive. While this court needs to be repaved and sealed, it also needs to have a better rain drainage system installed. Initial analysis of the sports court shows that more study is needed to determine how the drainage system can be improved. To do that, the CHCA will take some months to gather professional opinions on this matter.

For the past 20 years, the court has been used as half tennis and half hockey. Residents are encouraged to consider what they'd like to see on the "non-tennis" side of the court: Hockey? Pickle ball? Or another tennis court? The neighborhood will be notified when there is a plan in place.



On Saturday, April 8, the CHCA held its annual Easter Egg Hunt at the Crescent Hills Park. 50 children participated in group games and limbo-ed under the bunny stick before gathering eggs from the park grounds. They then visited with the Easter Bunny who handed out treat bags and prizes. Thanks to volunteers Karla Yoney, Andrea Getsy, Susan Chikalla, Ashley and Myla Madera, and Ed Blazina who guided participants and wrangled eggs!

A special "Thank You" to Spring Grove Road neighbor Alexandra Newby, a doctorate student at CMU, who has generously acted as Easter Bunny for about 12 Egg Hunts. If Alexandra reprises her role in 2024, she will have to be addressed as "Dr. Easter Bunny"! It's heartening to see former participants return as older children or adults to help keep the Easter Egg Hunt a nice neighborhood event!

Expected spring park improvements:

- Replace: playground mulch, walking trail limestone dust and parking lot railroad ties (that mark parking spaces).
 - Repair: Natural wood fence on left side of walking trail.

Spring park "work" events:

- Thursday May 4 from 9 a.m. to 2 p.m.: students from Trinity Christian School have volunteered to rake leaves and sticks, weed, sweep and clean play equipment in CH Park.
- Saturday May 6 (rain date May 13) from 9 a.m. 12 noon: volunteer neighbors will place mulch in the play areas and garden spots. (Calling all able-bodied residents! Bring an iron rake, a shovel or a wheelbarrow)
- Saturday June 3 (tentative date) from 9 a.m. 12 noon): volunteer neighbors will add limestone dust to the walking trail. (same tools needed as above)

CH Park Reminders:

- The park is not officially rented for picnics or parties due to restrictions in space, parking, noise levels and clean up abilities. If you do have a picnic or group activity at the park and more than a can full of garbage is accumulated, please take it home with you!
 - No fireworks use on the grounds, not even "sparklers".
- The parking lot will be chained at dusk from May to October. There's no park or lot use after dark, not even to walk the dog. (You'd have to fight the deer off anyway!)
- Call 911 if you see illegal activities, fighting or equipment being damaged. It's best not to confront offenders yourself!

Neighbors like Dave Fraser from Glenfield Drive, who used his wood shredder to mulch woodpiles of sticks from the park, help make the CH park a clean, safe and pleasant green space to enjoy. Thanks to Dave and all those who use the park respectfully!
