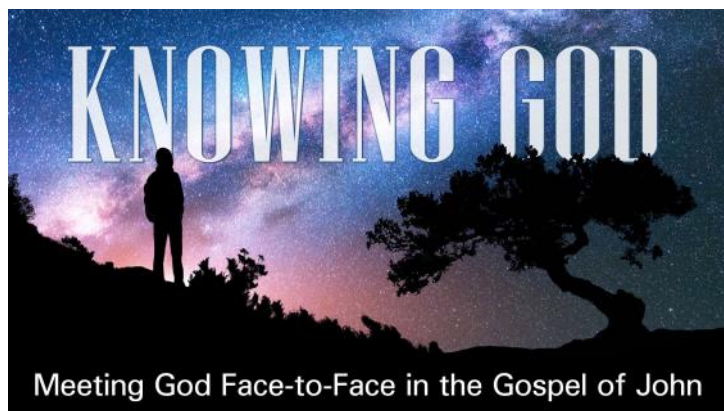

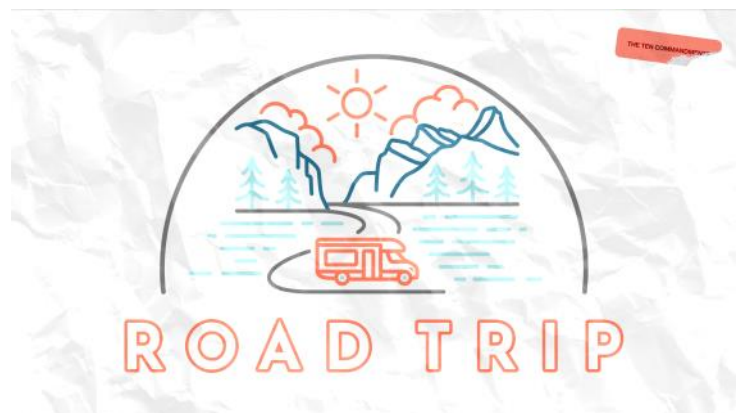

Homecoming Offering for New Playground

A generous donation has gotten us off to a good start for a new, bright, low-maintenance playground for our children, and as a powerful outreach tool. A new, fun, modern playground attracts families from the local community and that makes it easy for us to meet them, talk with them, and tell them more about our church without having to go find them. They come to us!

We already have \$17,800 toward the \$30,000 it will take to put in a beautiful new structure that will be maintenance-free for 25 years or more, other than putting down new mulch for the fall zones. There are few things a church can do to reach new families that are as powerful as catching the attention of children and attracting them!

You can, of course, give at any time, but on Homecoming Sunday we will be dedicating the extra offering we receive to advance this project. And while it has great outreach potential, it will also be used for all of our own children's activities.

OCC Shoeboxes



The third week in November Samaritans Purse will be collecting Shoeboxes from churches and individuals to prepare the boxes for their destination. We plan to have a packing party toward the end of October (date to be determined) and we ask that all other packed shoeboxes be brought to the church no later than the first week in November.

There should be no reason that each person in our church can't be involved in some way with this ministry. As individuals you may:

Volunteer to pack items donated (and purchased).

Pray for the child receiving a shoebox.



In addition to the completed shoeboxes, we will be sending boxes of fillers for the Processing Center to use for boxes that are not completely full. Hand-made items like scarves, hats, dresses and toys are welcomed.
