In Memory Of John "Jack" Tuomey

Jack Tuomey, 81, passed away on September 16, 2019, just 16 days after his wife of 60 years departed her earthly life. Jack was born on November 1, 1937, in Chicago, Illinois, to Dorothy and John Tuomey, Sr. The oldest of eight siblings, he learned to care for others at an early age. Jack loved playing quarterback on the football team and catcher on the base-

ball team at Tilden Technical High School, where he graduated in 1955. A talented artist, Jack worked as a draftsman until he joined the United States Air Force in 1956. While in the Air Force stationed in Kansas, Jack met his future wife of 60 years, Sarabeth, on the second tee box at the Abilene Country Club. Jack served four years of active duty with the USAF and continued to serve in the USAF Reserve. He retired with 28 years of service. A 1966 graduate of Kansas State University with a degree in Landscape Architecture, Jack used his degree at the U.S. Forest Service, the Tennessee Valley Authority and eventually the City of Fort Worth, where he retired in 1997 as Development Coordinator. Jack and Sarabeth were married on January 31, 1959. Together, they spent the next 60 years raising three boys; coaching football, baseball and basketball; and traveling with friends. Jack was raised a Master Mason in 1961 and, in May 1971, he joined the Moslah Shrine in Fort Worth. Jack was a charter member of the Moslah Shrine Legion of Honor, serving as Commander in 1996 and later as International Commander in 2012. Jack's thoughtful and stable leadership will be incredibly missed. Jack was preceded in death by his parents Dorothy and John, Sr. and sister, Joyce. SURVIVORS: Jack and Sarabeth's beloved children, Jay; Scott and wife, Stacey; Troy and wife, Sandra. Jack's siblings are Allan Tuomey and wife, Peggy; Elaine Witherspoon; David Tuomey and wife, Rosalie; Faythe Taylor and husband, Tim; Denis Tuomey and wife, Karen; and Debbie Campbell and husband, Tim. Cherished grandchildren are Austin, Tara, Lexi, Landon, Danielle, Will, Jackson and Mason.






International Lieutenant Commanders

I am going to leave Moslah's name in the notes because they deserve to be recognized for trying to increase their membership.

NOTES:

- 1. Wall of Honor in the MOSLAH LOH room, showcasing bootcamp photos of MOSLAH Shriners (both LOH members and non-members)
- For stated/called meetings LOH members can wear relaxed collared embroidered shirts. Provides for a more relaxed atmosphere and easy change-over from day job.
- 3. Find areas to get involved in. Inject ourselves into ceremonies, events, etc.
- 4. Support Potentate in everything = this equals exposure
- 5. Send letters to all MOSLAH veterans for Veteran's Day and/or Memorial Day
- 6. Put on a military ball
- 7. Have special ceremonies when able
- 8. Ask veterans in MOSLAH to wear the branch pins on their FEZ
- Ask veterans in MOSLAH to wear ribbon stack on their coats during stated meetings
- 10. Utilize "friends of veterans" within MOSALH for assistance, recognize their efforts
- 11. Shriner spotlights, highlight heroism and service of current MOSLAH veterans
- 12. Leasing flags for yearly posting of colors. (5x a year)
- 13. Conduct Flag retirement ceremonies
- 14. Flag etiquette classes?
- 15. Provide a table for each veteran at some function for them to display their military items

Outside of that...here is my opinion on "the way forward". I'm not the Commander, so I'm not saying this is what we WILL do...I'm just throwing out my opinion so you can make whatever decisions need to be made.

WAY FORWARD:

We need "leads" to recruit from. Veteran's Day is our closest military holiday. We don't need to rush to create a large event, etc., but we do need to recognize our members' service, and we want to recognize it with honor and pride. The name of the game is getting as many people interested as possible, from there, we'll get a feel of who might be full-time participants and who might be part -time help-where-l-can participants.

1. Gather leads: Divan, LOH and friends personally reach out to members to conduct a verbal "health and welfare check" and determine veteran status and affiliated military branches and double check mailing address/phone

numbers/etc. The pitch: we'd like to ensure they are doing well and we want to recognize them and send them a special gift in appreciation of their service.

2. Plant the seed: Divan and LOH mail out a gift and a typed up, but personalized letter, to each member - thanking them for their service and giving them a call to action. We can purchase and send them the branch pin for their Fez (if that's possible). The call to action is asking them to attend our next stated meeting (or the November meeting) wearing that pin on their Fez AND bringing a copy of a photo of their service (whether a bootcamp photo, etc) for the LOH room.

The gift can also simply be a small flag with a touching letter, etc.

- 3. Water the crops: Follow up phone calls being made by Divan and LOH about a week after mailing out the gifts. Make sure they received the gifts and verbally ask them to comply with the call to action.
- 4. Guide the growth of the crops: During the first stated meeting of the temple, allocate 10-15 minutes to officially recognize the veterans amongst our Nobles. Nice touching speech. Perhaps a group photo. Emphasize the importance of LOH. Hand out invitations to LOH's first meeting and emphasize that they DO NOT have to contribute large amounts of time if they join.
- 5. Harvest the crops: Late November, follow up phone calls/Face-to-face visits/etc., with as many MOSLAH veterans as possible especially those that expressed interest in LOH. Internally, we will start categorizing them. Some will be willing and able to participate in upcoming events (sometimes all events, sometimes only one here and there), some will want to participate but don't have much time (in which case we ask them to pay dues and help when they can)

From there, it's management of volunteers. We'll have a handful of dedicated members, the rest, we'll ask them to participate in specific events far in advance.

6. Enjoy the meal: MOSLAH LOH needs to put on an awards banquet. Something semi-formal that allows us to recognize community partners, LOH members and family, Non-veteran friends and supporters, etc. Plaques. Medals. Even something as simple as a personally signed group photo can go a long way.

Anyhow, those are my thoughts. I look forward to the first meeting, regardless. Thank you again for having me over! :-)
