- 1. Sunday April 14, 2019 Pacific Dawn, Pacific **9** spots open. 1500 Anchors Way Drive Ventura, CA 93001, 805-676-3474. The boat usually loads about 7-8pm. You take your gear down and get a bunk. The boat departs about 10 PM or if everyone is there, sooner. White Sea bass, Halibut, Ling Cod or best fishing available. Galley is provided and no coolers on the boat.
- 2. Wednesday May 15, 2019 Sea Jay **STANDBYs**, 4151 Victoria Avenue Oxnard, CA 93035, 805 382 1612. Boat usually leaves approximately 330 to 4am. You can sleep on the boat if you get there by 8pm. Meetings are held the second Wednesday of the month at Mimi's Restaurant in Monrovia. Mimi's has accommodated us with separate The Coastal Conservation Association (CCA) was initially created in 1977, after drastic commercial overfishing along the Texas coast had decimated redfish and speckled trout populations. A group of recreational anglers gathered to create the Gulf Coast Conservation Association. Only four years later, gill nets along the Texas coast were outlawed and both red drum and speckled trout were declared game fish. The successful conservation movement that started with the "Save the Redfish" campaign got the attention of anglers across the Gulf and by 1985; chapters had formed all along the Gulf Coast. CCA continued to grow within the South- and Mid-Atlantic regions in the 1990s, and now have chapters formed up and down the West Coast. There are now 19 states with 226 local chapters that have a growing membership of 126,000 members.

CCA will be operating a kid's ocean trip this April aboard the Monte Carlo out of 22nd Street landing on Tuesday April 16, 2019. The boat leaves at 6am and I'll be asking for volunteers to help with the kids.

CCA also has a fund-raising Bar B Que the Third Saturday in May at the Long Beach Rod and Gun Club. More information will be made available as it is received.

If you didn't join at Fred Hall, NOW is the time to support our sport!!!!!!

Trip Fare \$210. Food, Tips and Fish cleaning are not included.

No coolers, ice chests, alcoholic beverages, illegal drugs, weapons or explosives are permitted on board the vessel at any time. There is a galley and you can order a hot breakfast and a lunch for an additional fee. We have a \$250 galley minimum. So please plan to help with that by purchasing your food and drinks.

Special Information A 15% gratuity is customary for all Charters based on Charter price. Galley gratuity based on total spent in Galley. Be sure to have your 2019 Fishing License. Check in at the Landing and they will tell you where to park.

Directions to the landing: Ventura Harbor Village is located on US-101 approximately 30 miles South of Santa Barbara and 65 miles North of Los Angeles. From US-101 North: - Exit Seward Ave. - Turn Left on Seward Ave. - Turn Left on Harbor Blvd. - Turn Right on Beachmont St. - Continue on Anchors Way Dr.

Hi everyone, we had a great morning for our surf fish trip on February 23rd. Ron Hall, Jose Dominguez, and myself showed up for a nice morning on the beach. Conditions were near perfect, sunny and clear, an incoming tide, but a little cool at first. We all caught a few fish and that qualified us for this years "WHOPPER BOARD". This months fresh water trip is planned for Lake Castaic on the 23rd. Fish either the lagoon or the upper lake.

Come to next weeks meeting to sign up or give me a call. Weather permitting we should have a good trip. Dave

These trips are open to all club members and your guests. There is no cost involved other than beach parking and entry into the lakes.

Only game fish are eligible for the five fish jack pot entry. The total weight of up to five fish will be your entry. Surf fish only Corbina, Perch and Halibut. No Sharks or Rays. Fresh water Trout, Small Mouth Bass, Large Mouth Bass, Stripers and Cat Fish. No Carp or Gold Fish. You can use either natural or artificial baits.

Start any time after the lakes open or 7:00 am for surf fishing. We usually fish the lakes until 2;00 pm and surf fish until noon or until high tide.

If you are interested in going on these outings and have never been before, let me know and if there is enough interest, we can have a

Saturday morning get together to discuss tackle and techniques.

Remember, everyone is welcome to participate. That means bring your kids, grand kids, great grand kids, friends and neighbors.

All of the lakes have boat launching, boat rentals, shore fishing as well as float tube and kayak access. One last note, if you are a

boater bring a non-boater member with you.
