





















### Is hard, but necessary

"I don't care if they do open the church. I ain't going back!"


"Looks like we're going to have to cancel all programs for the rest of the year."

"PLEASE MUTE YOUR PHONES!!!"



#### What Coronavirus Has Done to the Church

- ~ 90% of regular churchgoers in the US saying their churches had closed to combat COVID-19
- Vast majority saying worship services had moved entirely online.
- Historically black churches and those who describe themselves as very religious are particularly likely to say their faith has strengthened
- One-quarter of U.S. adults overall (24%) say their faith has become stronger because of the coronavirus pandemic, while just 2% say their faith has become weaker.
- April 2020: 2/3 of churches in the US where hit hard financial by COVID-19, black church are ADAPTING and GIVING in OTHER WAYS

## Challenged to Change

- COVID 19 has FORCED our churches to redefine how we PURSUE, VIEW, and DO Christian ministry
- The church never closed!
- Technology and imagination is forcing the church to place faith in God to do a new thing instead of sustaining comfort
- God's people are HUNGRY FOR A WORD, not doctrine, denomination, and demagoguery
  - "...feed my sheep." John 21:17
- Ministry is becoming more PERSONAL AND ENGAGING (online worship, community outreach, accessibility to counseling, etc.)
- Youth and young adults are MORE AVAILBILE





#### OPPORTUNITIES TO GROW

- Social media and email access: Free\*
- Website: \$230/yr (Appr. 20.mo)
- Online giving (PayPal, Cash App, Givelify, Venmo, etc.) Est. 1.5% fee from bank account
- High speed BUSINESS internet and phone: \$89+/mo (depending on internet speed)
- Media streaming equipment:
  - PTZ Optics camera: \$1,600
  - Camera interface: \$250
  - Refurbished desktop: \$150
  - Streaming software: \$60
  - Wiring, cables, and accessories \$1,400
- Estimated one time cost: ~\$4,260
- Annual costs: ~\$1,400
- Consider PRIVATE grants and fundraising to help with costs
