

Certificate of Merit

On July 4, 2022, a vote was taken at the MTAC Convention business meeting to pass an amendment that would allow for an in-person option for Certificate of Merit in the future (This has colloquially been referred to as "Hybrid CM"). This motion passed overwhelmingly (Over 100 delegates voted in favor, less than 30 opposed). However, in the FAQ provided alongside the proposed amendment, the MTAC State Office made it clear that time needed to update the online system would be approximately 8 months, making it impossible for the system to be fully ready in 2023. Because of this, we find it highly unlikely that an in-person option will be available to students for CM 2023. Teachers should be prepared for at least one more year of fully online CM.

If you navigate to your portal on new.mtac.org and click on Certificate of Merit you will see information for this year's evaluations. We've included a screenshot below as well. All videos, sight-reading and theory exams must be completed by February 21st, 2023, which is even earlier than last year!! Regarding the earliest dates students may upload their videos, the State Office hasn't released that information yet.

We suggest spacing out your filming. When students have completed a piece, have them come in a nice outfit, and film it for them (or have them film it at home). Then you avoid having to film all of the songs, last minute, in February. Our Branch Recitals and Festivals, as well as your own Studio Recitals, will also provide an excellent opportunity to film students in a concert setting—Concert recordings are perfectly acceptable for CM, provided the filming angle meets the CM guidelines. 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PRESIDENTS MESSAGE

By the time you read this, we will have had our welcome luncheon potluck at my home on October 1st, 20211. If you were not able to attend, the branch directories passed out will be available for pick-up-see in the newsletter for more details!

We welcome four new members to MTACLB this year: Voice teacher Melissa Caldretti, Piano teacher Katie Klein, Violin teacher Moni Simeonov, and Piano/Composition teacher Samara Rice (who has also taken on the responsibility of ASCAP chair for this year). We're glad that you have chosen to join the Long Beach Branch, and we look forward to seeing you at our meetings and hearing your students at our recitals!

We will be hosting two more events in October after the welcome luncheon. On the 12th from 10:00 am to 11:30 am, we will have a roundtable discussion on Studio Management. Our Second Vice-President Yukiko Nobles will send information on this meeting. At our new principal recital venue, the Bjerke Fellowship Hall at Our Saviour's Lutheran Church (OSLC-BFH), we will have the first of three yearly branch recitals on October 22nd, hosted by Andrea Chou-Wu and myself.

Looking ahead, we will meet on November 9 at my home again to hear a talk by a colleague of mine from Santa Barbara, Dr. Alexandra Birch. You'll hear more about her as we approach her talk, but I thought I'd take this opportunity to explain a little bit about what her talk will be about, specifically regarding the title of her lecture "Musical Stolpersteine -Recovered Music from Atrocity and Reincorporation into the Canon." If you are unfamiliar, a Stolperstein (plural Stolpersteine) is, in German, literally a "stumbling stone," and more specifically a type of public memorial for victims of the Holocaust. Dr. Birch's research focuses on recovering scores of composers who were the victims of persecution and genocide. Because of their circumstances, these composers' works are often lost, which means that regardless of their quality they cannot be memorialized into our musical canon ("canon" meaning all the pieces we know that are performed and discussed regularly). I'll let her explain further, but as I understand it, her talk will focus in part on the role we teachers play in passing on that musical canon to our students, and how we can therefore participate in exposing our students to these musical Stolpersteine-pieces of music through which we memorialize those who might otherwise have remained forgotten.

Alright, that's probably enough heavy discussion for now. Please enjoy our newsletter, and look forward to more information about our events coming soon!

CERTIFICATE OF MERIT

Some key reminders for CM-The most important upcoming dates are the following:

October 31 is the deadline to apply for CM

November 5 is the deadline for parents to pay their CM fees

January 15 is the deadline to edit CM applications (in other words, the last day to edit your students' repertoire lists)

February 21 is the deadline to upload media (in other words, the last day to submit CM materials).

Please note this date is MUCH earlier than MTAC Long Beach teachers may be accustomed to (Before the pandemic, our in-person evaluations were usually held near the end of March—our deadline this year is a whole month earlier!)

The following is from the CM state chair Michelle Rumley as published in the most recent MTAC organization-wide newsletter (September 2022):

The 2023 Certificate of Merit enrollment will begin soon! This year's evaluations will be held exclusively through the online MTAC Testing Portal. The CM 2024 Season will debut an in-person Testing option. More information will be provided in the coming months.

Happy November!

We will be hosting two events in November. On the 9th from 10:30 am to 12:00 pm, we will have a lecture by Alexandra Birch–Violinist and PhD student in History at UCSB–titled "Musical Stolpersteine - Recovered Music from Atrocity and Reincorporation into the Canon." NOVEMBER GENERAL MEETING

On October 12 at 10 am we held in-person general meeting at home of Louise Earhart on the topic of Studio management. Our discussion included: how teachers are recording or letting students record themselves; how parents/students pay for their lessons, using Zelle, Venmo, or using checks and cash; community of students and teachers; value of our membership; how to retain the students of especially around middle school age; how to develop student's sight-reading skills. Even though our discussion was not focused on one or two topics, all the attendees seemed to benefit from our discussion and enjoyed each other. Thanks to Louise who provided us her home to have our first general meeting of this fiscal year!

We hope you will join us in our next general meeting on Wednesday, November 9, 10:30 am at Marc Lombardino's home. Dr. Alexandra Birth will present "Musical Stolpersteine – Recovered Music from Atrocity and Music from Atrocity and Reincorporation into the Canon". I asked her to describe her topic and received her answer:

Across Europe, victims of the Nazi regime are commemorated with small stones outside their pre-war homes and businesses. These micro-memorials are called *Stolpersteine* and incorporate a difficult history of detention and genocide into the daily fabric of life. Within classical music, we primarily perform a European or Western canon of works - but this collection of pieces is an incomplete narrative without including composers missing or silenced by atrocity. I address my two primary research areas - the Holocaust and the Soviet Gulag - and the corresponding German(ic) and Russian 'canons' of classical music with practical suggestions of how we can include more diverse programing, where to begin finding scores, and performer suggestions when dealing with difficult materials.

This year the Long Beach Branch will combine the SCJBF and Baroque festival into a single live event to be held on Saturday, February 18, 2023.

Participating teachers must enter students for the Bach and Baroque festival by using the registration system at scjbf.org Please contact the chair ahead of the January 21 entry deadline if you need assistance.

All participating students will be evaluated and receive written comments by three judges.

Piano students who participate in the Festival with original keyboard works composed by J.S. Bach (music from the Anna Magdalena Bach Notebook, ANH 113-132 may only be used at the Branch level) will be eligible for selection to compete at the SCJBF Region III keyboard festival in May 2023. At least 50% of eligible pianists will be selected for Regional.

Singers, string and wind players, together with pianists performing Baroque repertoire that is not eligible for the Keyboard Regional Festival will be considered for Honorable Mention.

Students playing instruments other than organ shall not have reached age 19 by April 1; organists, age 22; and vocalists, age 25. Age limits do not apply to instrumentalists and vocalists at the branch level who may receive an Honorable Mention. They are only relevant for instrumentalist, organists, and vocalists participating in the Regional festivals or CWA.

Please note: SCJBF organizes All-Branch Regional Festivals for Strings and Winds/Voice categories. These events combine both Branch and Regional levels and usually take place in April and May. Member News from Althea Waites

Pianist Althea Waites has launched a new project to introduce music for piano that has never been recorded by African-American composer, Margaret Bonds (1913-1972).

She has been collaborating with Dr. John Michael Cooper, musicologist and Professor of Music at Southwestern University/ Texas, and received copies of works that he researched with the expectation that they would be recorded along with additional pieces that are rarely heard.

Bonds lived and worked in Los Angeles at the Inner City Cultural Institute from 1967 until her death in 1972, and also had two choral works with orchestra performed by the Los Angeles Philharmonic.

She was also a brilliant concert pianist and composed over 500 works for orchestra, song cycles with poems of Langston Hughes and arrangements of spirituals. In addition to her work as a composer, Bonds was a strong and deeply committed advocate for students, musicians and emerging African-American composers throughout the United States.

The recording will include works by Samuel Coleridge-Taylor, Jeremy Siskind, and Curt Cacioppo's "Fantasy-Choruses on This Little Light of Mine", a piece which was written for and dedicated to Ms. Waites.

The recording will be available for release during the first half of 2023.

Dear Fellow Teachers!

It's February, and we've got a lot going on this month! This month we have our second Branch Recital on Feb 4, our Bach/Baroque Festival on February 19, and a Voice Masterclass at our General Meeting on February 26. I'm going to attempt at the first two of these events to both record and livestream the recitals over zoom at the following link:

The Certificate of Merit deadline is fast approaching! February 21st is the last day to submit CM Materials on the online portal.

With all these things happening in quick succession, and with our students moving into one of the busiest times of the school year, it can start to feel a bit overwhelming (I speak for myself, and a few of my students). I'm reminded often that it's important to take a step back and look at the bigger picture; remembering that as many little things come up for us and our students, our goal is to instill our students with long-term musical values.

Also, thinking long term, seeing how quickly things approach in February is letting me plan for February of next year, 2024, when our CM deadline will move even earlier. If you've been wondering why CM has been moving earlier each of the past years, there is indeed an explanation. There are 6 regions, and each region is assigned a week for their CM deadline. These weeks are 6 weeks from February to mid-March. February 21 is the "week 3" deadline. Next year, our region will be in week 2 (February 14/15), the following year, 2025, we will be week 1 (February 7/8!). Then, in 2026, our deadline will move back to week 6 (March 14/15). This is how the system works currently, but it is possible changes will be made.

On Thursday April 6, a good friend of mine, Tanner Cassidy, will give a music theory presentation. He will discuss Topic Theory, a somewhat recent analytical method in the broader field of academic music theory which covers a lot of the typical "tropes" we hear in music. Mozart and Haydn particularly benefit from this kind of analysis, as it helps us to hear, two and a half centuries later, all the references and implied jokes in their instrumental music.

Thanks to Marc Lombardino who provided the zoom room and hosted the meeting, on March 22 we had a roundtable discussion on new repertoire. Please contact me if you would like a list of the repertoire discussed.

We hope you will join our next general meeting on **Thursday, April 6**, at 10 via zoom. Tanner Cassidy will present Topic Theory which is a method of analysis where you identify typical tropes in a piece and their cultural relevance at the time, for instance, a horn call in a classical indicating an association with nobility. He will discuss this theory both broadly related to his dissertation and specifically involving a Mozart sonata, K. 332, in F Major.

The followings are his short bio:

Tanner Cassidy is a Ph.D. student in music theory. His research interests include twentieth-century Japanese music, topic theory, film music, music and politics, jazz, and neo-Riemannian theory. His dissertation focuses on the ways that postwar Japanese composers incorporated musical topics into film scores, and how these composers contributed to the construction of narrative allegory as a response to postwar political and cultural changes. He has presented at the Music and the Moving Image conference and Music Theory Midwest.

Tanner teaches music theory classes in the Music Department, and also coaches jazz ensembles and conducts the UCSB Pops Orchestra. Off campus, Tanner is on the board of Opera Santa Barbara, and is also an employee of the Music Academy of the West.

April General Meeting

If you were unable to attend the April general meeting presented by Tanner Cassidy who is a PhD candidate in Music Theory at the University of California, Santa Barbara, it is available at https://youtu.be/zk2WY57dXxk. His presentation is titled Hearing Cultural References Through "Topic Theory", and I hope you will take time to listen and watch it. He described his presentation as follows.

Our whole life, we're trained to hear musical references subliminally. Hearing a minor scale when a villain appears in a movie or associating the sound of the snare drum with the military are common examples of the ways that music can contain cultural codes that reach back into history. These moments are called "musical topics" by modern music theorists, and have a long history within and beyond Western art music, with music theorists particularly fascinated with music of the late-18th century. Topic theory provides a way to look at music as it communicates with other pieces, to learn the references of a piece in order to hear how its original audiences heard it. In hi presentation he provided (1) a brief description of what musical topics are, (2) an overview of some of the common topics encountered in classical music, (3) a topical analysis of Mozart's Piano Sonata in F Major (K. 332), and (4) some brief discussion of topics in other periods and styles beyond the Classical.
