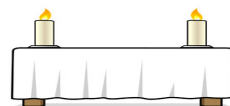

SERVICE IN OUR PARISH

Music Ministry

You may notice certain changes to our music during Lent. Because the purpose of music at church is to draw into worship and the spirit of the liturgical season, our music during Lent will generally be more somber, sparse, and less joyful. This does not mean that it is less prayerful or meaningful. Music during the Lenten season should always be taking our focus back to repentance and conversion. So, to that end, there will be no Gloria in during Lent, except on special feast days. We will not hear joyful proclamation of "Alleluia!" again until the Easter Vigil. Also, during Lent there will be no closing song of praise, only an instrumental or silence. This again is to remind us that our work of conversion and repentance continues as we leave Mass; we are still, 'In the desert', as Jesus was for 40 days. A lot of people think that Lent is depressing and dreary, but in a way Lent is still a joyful time. It is the time when we temporarily renounce all of our lesser joys, whatever they may be, and give space for God to give us the greatest joy, the gift of Himself. We discover that even in the dryness and struggle of Lent, St Paul's words still apply, "Rejoice in the Lord always, again I say rejoice!"
