Even an "easy" birth can be difficult on your newborn. Get your baby's spine checked to allow your baby's nerve system to function well.

CDC Recommended vaccination on day of birth - Hepatitis B

FACT: The United States has the **HIGHEST** first day Infant Mortality rate of industrialized nations. *European countries do not vaccinate on the first day of birth routinely and are ranked amongst the lowest for first day infant mortality rate (IMR).* 

**FACT**: Hepatitis B is a viral infection that infects the liver and requires direct contact with infected blood or other body fluids for transmission through intercourse or IV drug usage. It's not common in childhood and primarily affects those ages 20 to 50.

FACT: The CDC started recommending this vaccination to newborns and infants when public health officials and doctors were unable to convince those at risk to receive this vaccination. Birth care providers regularly screen pregnant women for Hepatitis B.

FACT: As of 4/7/16, the Vaccine Adverse Events Reporting System (VAERS), reported 10,878 adverse reactions reported for children less than 6 months receiving this vaccine including seizures, high fevers and death. The CDC estimates that only 10% of adverse reactions are reported.

Ingredients in this vaccine might include **aluminum**, formaldehyde and **aluminum hydroxide**. It has not been tested against a placebo for safety and it has not been evaluated for carcinogenic or mutagenic potential. or for impairment for fertility.
