Week of Prayer for Christian Unity January 18 - January 25

The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity (an Octave of eight days) is an international Christian ecumenical observance kept annually since 1894. The Theme for this year is inspired

by Acts 28:2 "They showed us unusual kindness" and calls us to shared action. The theme recalls the shipwreck of Paul on the island of Malta and asks us to show greater generosity to those in need.

" In order to unite with one another, we must love one another, in order to love one another, we must know one another, in order to know one another, we must go and meet one another."

These words are known as the Testament of Cardinal Mercier, a Belgian Cardinal (1851-1926, a noted scholar, author, and educator.

At the end of this week the Church celebrates the Feast of the Conversion of St. Paul with these words; "O God, who taught the whole world through the preaching of the blessed Apostle Paul, draw us, we pray nearer to you and so make us witnesses to your truth in the world...."

Pre-Authorized Payment Plan (PAPP) at St. Theresa's (optional): If you have automatic withdrawals taken from your bank account to pay your bills, then you already understand how the Pre-Authorized Payment Plan works. At St. Theresa's you also have the option to make all of your offerings by automatic withdrawal. This means that the envelopes contained in the box of envelopes that represent your Weekly Sunday Offering and the monthly envelope for My Extra Help can be set up for automatic withdrawal. Other Special Collections can be included when you register to use the Pre-Authorized Payment Plan.

Using the Pre-Authorized Payment Plan for your offerings allows you to give intentionally, proportionally and faithfully to St. Theresa's, St. Vincent de Paul and the Archdiocese of Halifax-Yarmouth, even when you are not able to attend in person especially during the winter or when you are away on vacation.

The Pre-Authorized Payment Plan replaces the need to write cheques or have cash on hand and ensures that church finances are kept stable. If you make your Weekly Sunday Offering, My Extra Help and other special offerings by envelope, please consider switching.

It's easy to get started. Registration forms are available on the tables in the entrances to the Church. You can still participate in the Sunday offertory by placing your numbered envelope in the regular collection basket and circle the PAPP option which is preprinted on each envelope. Once registered for PAPP you can make changes to the amount of your offering, the collections in which you participate or discontinue use of PAPP by contacting the Parish Office. You will also still receive a charitable donation receipt for your income tax return.
