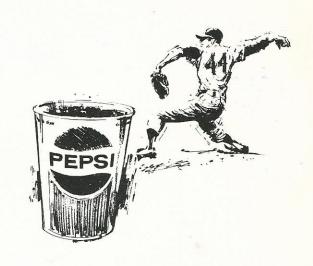
Catch That Pepsi Spirit

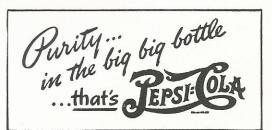

A get well quick to club member Joe Brown who has been battling an illness since July. His wife, Ernette assures us it won't be long before Joe will be attending club meetings.

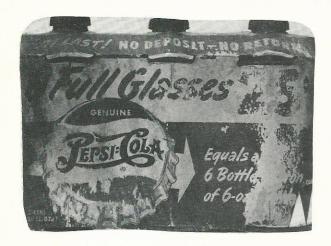

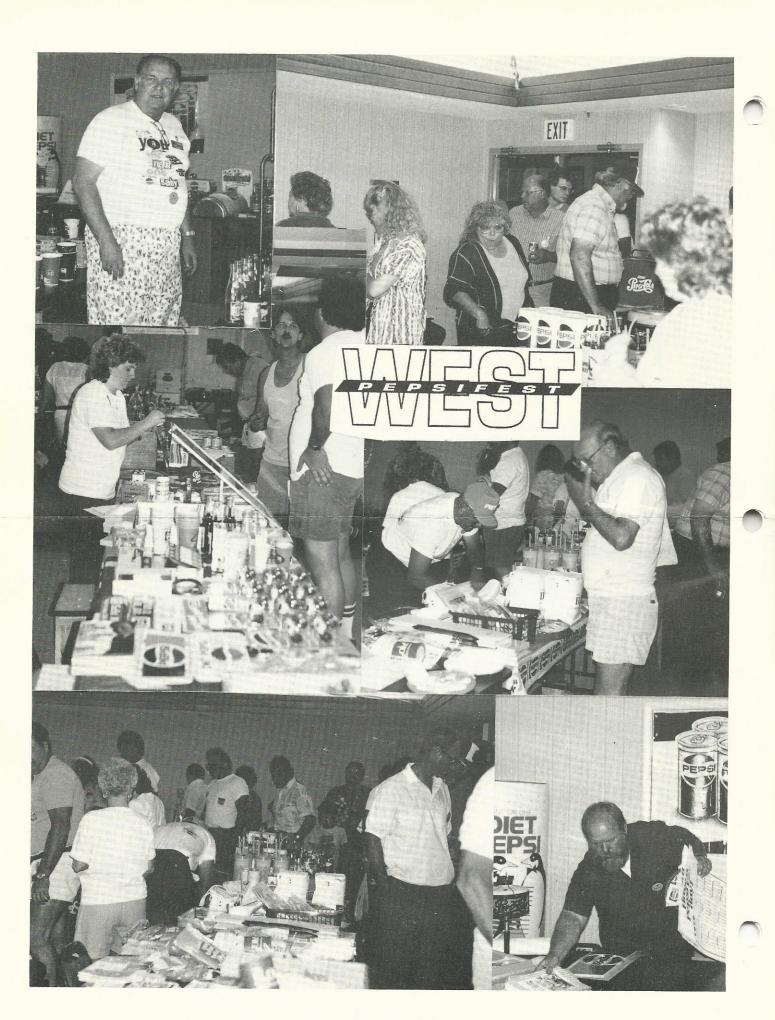
Here is a rare ad from the Pepsi-Cola Corporation of Richmond, Virginia. This was the headquarters of Pepsi-Cola during the late 1920's.

Pepsi History

It has always been my belief that one of the most important contributions to the success of Pepsi-Cola was made by the franchise bottlers. These innovative pioneers overcame the challenges of the times, to build the foundation for one of the greatest success stories in American corporate history.

One such pioneer family is the Johnson's of Memphis, Missouri. The Johnson's have been soft drink bottlers since 1927 when J. Harold & Muriel A. Johnson, now deceased, started their first bottling operations at 204 S. Market. They operated under the name of "Memphis Bottling Works".

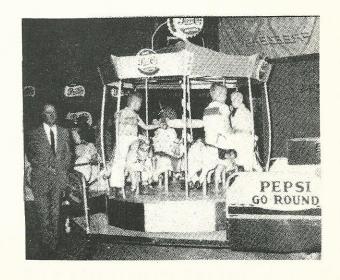
Mr. Weldon Smith, a close associate of Mr. Johnson, had obtained a Pepsi-Cola franchise in 1934, and convinced Mr. Johnson to apply for his own territory. Mr. Smith arranged a meeting for him with George and V.O. Robertson, representatives of Pepsi-Cola Company. The Johnsons were granted a Pepsi-Cola franchise on Oct. 31,1935. A unit of Pepsi at that time sold for \$315.00. This "unit" contained enough concentrate, crowns, and lables to bottle 1200 cases of 12-oz. product.

Mr. Johnson's investment paid off, today the "Pepsi-Cola Memphis Bottling Co., Inc." employs 71 men and women in three communities, serving Pepsi-cola to some 110,000 people in 8 counties.

Mr. Michael Johnson, grandson of the founder, is the President of operations and his father, John Johnson is the C.E.O. and member of the Pepsi-Cola Collectors Club.

"Hey, Stormin' Norman! You've just annihilated the fourth largest army in the world! What are you going to do now?"

"I'm going to crack open a Diet Pepsi."

t was the mother, father and next of kin of all product placements — too insanely great to be true. And yet there it was. Clearly visible on the table directly in front of the commander in chief during the historic cease-fire ceremony was a lone can of Diet Pepsi.

As the official pool photo of the event was beamed around the world to thousands of newspapers, Pepsico executives were jubilant. It was the biggest coup since the live pictures of U.S. troops watching the Super Bowl in front of a Pepsi machine.

For Pepsi, it was the culmination of a hugely successful campaign to associate its products with the winning side in the gulf war. True, Pepsi had enjoyed a regional edge over its chief competition for some time. In the late 60's, Coca-Cola had been expelled from the Arab world after opening a bottling plant in Israel. Pepsi, meanwhile, had shrewdly detoured the Holy Land and gone on to build 24 plants in the future war zone alone.

So when country called, Pepsi had the infrastructure. With plants cranked up for 24-hour production, Pepsi began producing 12 million cans a month as part of an exclusive contract with U.S. forces. Coke could only look on with horror.

But surely the CINC (commander in chief) could requisition any beverage he wanted, including The Real Thing? Did the presence of a Diet Pepsi can signify an actual preference on the part of "God," as he is affectionately known to his troops?

When pressed, Pepsi executive Barry Holt was circumspect. "We think we have a loyal following in the General. The best we can piece together, what with the dryness of the desert, he's probably got a Diet Pepsi with him at all times."

Wishful thinking? When I sought confirmation from a source close to General Schwarzkopf in Riyadh, there was a nervous silence on the line as he contemplated the implications. When the answer finally came, it was terse, but unequivocal: "The CINC drinks Diet Pepsi."

Eat death, Coke.

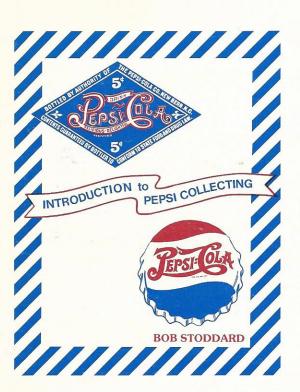
