The Indiana Resource Center for Autism (IRCA) does not endorse any particular activity or organization on this list. Camps listed specifically serve persons with disabilities and/or include this population in their program. Some solely serve children and/or adults on the autism spectrum. Parents are advised to investigate the opportunities presented below to determine the appropriateness of each activity for their family member.

More and more families are checking their local YMCA, Parks and Recreation department, and even private gyms and recreational facilities and finding that programs have been, or are being, developed for children and/or adults with disabilities. For example, there are martial arts programs available in some communities for individuals with special needs, and there also martial arts programs that include people on the autism spectrum.

Some programs have an "inclusion coordinator" or other staff designated to support children and/or adults with disabilities. Within this listing, you will notice a few programs offered by these types of organizations around Indiana. You are encouraged to check with various organizations in your community to inquire about their specialized programs and/or supports within existing programs to accommodate children and adults with disabilities, including individuals on the autism spectrum.

Additionally, Special Olympics Indiana might be an option for your family members who have an interest in playing a variety of sports. Special Olympics Indiana provides year-round sports training and athletic competition in over twenty Olympic-type sports for children and adults with disabilities in communities across Indiana. Summer Programs available:

CHAMP (Children's Health Analysis and Maintenance Program) is a program to assist the nearly 20% of Indiana children who struggle to maintain a healthy weight and body image. This 8-week course, taught by a registered dietician and physical therapist, helps children learn to maintain healthy bodies. Parental participation is required. Classes will be grouped by age and are appropriate for children 5 to 16. Cost: \$250 or \$100 registration fee plus insurance coverage for physical therapy; insurance, Medicaid, and waivers accepted

Toddler Talk is an 8-week social program focused on early literacy and uses favorite childhood books, crafts and snacks to promote social, fine motor and language skills. This program is taught by an occupational therapist and a physical therapist. Ages 1½ to 4.

Cost: \$200 or \$50 registration fee plus insurance for therapy; insurance, Medicaid, and waivers accepted **Adventure Club** is an adventurous social group that uses a book club format. Occupational and speech therapists will work together to teach reading and writing strategies which improve comprehension and expression skills before school next year. This class will include field trips and will wrap up with a pizza party. Children ages 5 to 16 can join groups divided into appropriate age groups.

Girl Talk is a social group for girls only! Girls ages 10 to 16 can participate in this 6-week long social program taught by occupational and speech therapists. This program focuses on increasing social and community integration skills. Activities include things girls like, and the girls will practice skills in the clinic one week and then go out and practice them in a real world setting then next. Girls ages 10 to 16. Cost: \$325 or \$50 registration fee plus insurance coverage for therapy; insurance, Medicaid, and waivers accepted.

In the Zone is based on the highly successful *Zones of Regulation* used by many school systems. This sensory regulation system will help your child build a toolbox of strategies they select themselves to help them maintain a stable sensory and emotional state when they return to school in the fall.

Occupational and speech therapists work together to provide an intensive 6 weeks of instruction. Ages 8 to 14.

PCT (Personal Care Training) are boys- or girls-only classes geared toward children with Autism Spectrum Disorders. This six-week long group will practice personal care skills guided by a program that helps kids

understand why personal care skills are important and how our hygiene impacts those around us. "Coming of age" issues such as menstrual cycles and body odor will be addressed as needed. Family carry over will be necessary for success. Ages 10 to 16. Individual instruction is also available. Cost: \$250 or \$35 registration fee plus insurance coverage for occupational therapy; insurance, Medicaid, and waivers accepted

Kayaking is a 6-week class that meets Tuesday evenings at Eagle Creek Park. Basic kayaking skills are taught by a physical therapist with help from the Hoosier Canoe and Kayaking Club. All equipment is provided, and kids who finish the class are invited, with their families, to join our day trip through Turkey Run State Park in September (weather permitting). Ages 8 to 16.
