I can barely believe it but Lent begins this month! It seems like only a few days ago, we were celebrating the birth of our Savior, and now we march towards his death and resurrection.


This year, Lent begins with Ash Wednesday on February 14th. It feels like an appropriate day to begin Lent as we remember the acts Jesus gave in love for us.

Your Lenten Task Force has been hard at work preparing for Lent and Easter this year, and we hope you join us for all of our services and activities! We'll have devotionals available soon, as well as a flyer detailing worship services and other important information.

As we move into Lent this year, I encourage all of us to think deeply about things that keep us from drawing closer to God. Sometimes this takes the form of fasting or sacrificing something in imitation of Christ's sacrifice during his journey into the desert. We might give up coffee or bacon or some other thing that we'd miss consuming. Or we might choose to commit to doing something that brings us closer to God, like intentional prayer time, a Bible study or listening for God's voice. This year, my Lenten practice will be listening to my favorite prayer audio devotional Pray as You Go from the British Jesuit Ministries.

Whatever you choose to do, Lent is a time for repentance and forgiveness, which isn't always easy. It's hard to admit that sometimes, we're complicit in the world's problems. Sometimes, it's hard to admit that we're not perfect. But it's important to remember that God offers us grace and mercy in the midst of our own faults and failures.

I hope you'll join us on this Lenten journey. We begin with Ash Wednesday on February 14th. FPCMR will be hosting Ashes to Go on that Wednesday from 11 am to 1 pm and again from 4:00 pm to 5:30 pm. We recognize that it's sometimes hard for folks to attend services in the middle of their workday, but they still want to participate and receive ashes. Use the driveway between the church and the manse (like during our Chicken & Biscuit Drive-thru!) to receive ashes and prayer. Additionally, we've partnered with other area PCUSA to offer an Ash Wednesday worship service on the 14th at 7:00 pm at Canfield Presbyterian Church. Communion will be served as will the imposition of ashes. Your very own Pastor Kori will be preaching with Rev. Annie Parker from Heritage Presbyterian Church! Want to attend but don't want to drive? Contact us and we'll figure out carpool arrangements!

Souper Bowl of Caring Offering - February 9



This offering is the single largest way that Presbyterians join together to share God's love with our neighbors-in-need around the world. The three programs it supports are:


Presbyterian Disaster Assistance - goes to communities after the devastation of natural or human-caused disasters.




Self-Development of People - invests in communities to teach people to help themselves.

Per Capita remains at \$32.50. Special envelopes will be in the pews throughout the year. This offering is used for the administrative work of Eastminster Presbytery and the Presbyterian Church, USA. Our church will pay \$4,518 this year for each active member we had is 2022 (139). You can pay this anytime during the year.





One of our Christian Education Committee goals for 2023 was to host an informational session about mental health in our community. Unfortunately, we had to cancel our fall session, but were able to reschedule it for February 24, 2024!

The prevalence of mental health issues is everincreasing. Folks are reporting higher instances of anxiety and depression. According to the National Alliance for Mental Illness (NAMI) "Mental illness is a biological condition that affects the brain and it's functioning. It affects a person's ability to think as well as their emotions, mood and at times, judgement. Mental illness often impairs a person's ability to relate to others as well as how they function in their daily lives. Because the brain is highly complex, each person experiencing mental illness can have different symptoms and experiences, even people with the same diagnosis."

As a church community, we want to be supportive of those experiencing mental health issues, and become more informed about how to care for our members and friends. Join us on February 14th at 9 am to hear

a presentation about mental health diagnoses, effects on our community and the family. In addition, NAMI will teach us basic crisis intervention skills.
