I write this in advance of my retreat even beginning and I met with my spiritual director beforehand to visit with him and help set some goals for what I want to pursue during retreat and afterwards. Retreat is always refreshing because I get away physically and mentally. Retreat is different than vacation in the sense that I am there to reflect on what has gone on in my ministry, moving to new parishes, and settling in more and more.

Last week, I offered some observations and I tried to highlight the positives and some things to grow in as individuals and as a whole parish. I give more deliberate consideration to the celebration of the liturgy because of my background of assisting Bishop Swain with the celebration of Confirmations and other Masses throughout our diocese. During that time I could have been called a liturgist or one who studies the liturgy. Liturgy is public prayer of the Church and it can take the form of Mass, a wake service the night before a funeral, a wedding. Anything where people are gathered to pray and worship God with the leadership of a bishop, priest, or deacon is a liturgy. There is a joke that is often thrown around and it goes: what's the difference between a liturgist and a terrorist? You can negotiate with a terrorist. Liturgists have the reputation of being hard headed and unwilling to budge on certain things. The Church does make allowances for certain things but certain things are to be avoided.

The way that we worship as Catholics is very different from other Christian denominations. Some of these differences stem from our tradition since the Second Vatican Council the ways that the sacraments are celebrated have changed. In that time of transition and change there were some things that happened that were not expected but have become a pseudo tradition in different countries. I have been to Mass celebrated in many different ways and languages. This is the beauty of the Catholic Church because the word Catholic comes from two Greek words which mean 'in respect of the whole.' There are a couple of things that I wish to draw our attention to in regards to receiving Holy Communion. There are two options for receiving Holy Communion: either on the tongue or in the hand. The Church does not make a known preference of one over the other. When you are presented with either the Body or Blood of Christ, the proper response is the word 'Amen' which is the Hebrew word meaning 'so be it. Another element of receiving Holy Communion is being adequately prepared. This means that a person has fasted for at least one hour from food and drink (medicine is exempt) prior to receiving Holy Communion. Another part of preparation is that we should receive worthily. What I mean by this is that we should be free of any known mortal sins by going to the Sacrament of Confession. This teaching is derived from 1 Corinthians 11:27 where Saint Paul writes: "Therefore whoever eats the bread or drinks the cup of the Lord unworthily will have to answer for the body and blood of the Lord."

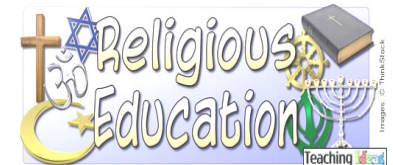
