# TAX COLLECTION INFO

For your convenience, real estate taxes can be receipted for the 2019 year if postmarked on or before Dec. 31 or placed in the drop box prior to January 2, 2020. The first half of your tax bill is due at the Village Hall by January 31, 2020 and the final payment is due at the County Treasurer's office by July 31, 2020.

#### SPEED ENFORCEMENT

Please note that the speed limits change as you enter and exit the Village. We have recently received numerous complaints regarding speeding throughout the Village and have requested extra enforcement. The locations will be North & South Main Street, Hwy 44/Lake to the west and W. Chestnut Street/County Road P to the East.

#### IF YOU HAVE A MAILBOX

If a mailbox is pushed over & has no impact marks, it was likely knocked over by the weight of snow coming off the plows lade. The Village of Pardeeville will not be responsible for mailbox damage in this case.

#### LICENSE YOUR PET(S)

Dog and cat licenses are required annually. You must bring in proof of rabies vaccination from your veterinarian's office (this must include date of vaccination, tag # and manufacturer of vaccine; not your receipt of services). Licenses are due by April 1, 2020 or a late fee will apply!

License Fees: Spayed/neutered dog or cat \$5.00. Unaltered dog or cat \$10.00. You can drop off your rabies certificates with payment and a self-addressed stamped envelope and we will mail your tags if you cannot make it to the office during open hours. Contact the clerk with questions or concerns.

#### **SNOW REMOVAL**

Don't forget that you must clear the snow/ice from your sidewalk within 24 hours after the snow has stopped. **Snow/ice should not be pushed or blown onto the street.** 

If there is a fire hydrant in the right-of-way on your property, please remove the snow around it. This is for your safety and the safety of your neighbors in case of a fire emergency this winter.

#### **WINTER PARKING RULES**

Winter parking rules are in effect from <u>November 15<sup>th</sup> to April 1st</u> between 1:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. Park cars on the odd or even side of the road that corresponds to the day from 1 a.m. to 6 a.m. (Example at 1 a.m. on the 16<sup>th</sup> you would need to be parked on the even side of the road.)

A SNOW EMERGENCY IS AUTOMATICALLY DECLARED when a snow is forecasted to be 3" or more during any period of 24 hours or less. Under a snow emergency **ALL** vehicles must be **OFF** the streets until they have been plowed. We will enforce our ordinance 32-155. IF YOU ARE A LANDLORD PLEASE NOTIFY YOUR

#### **BUILDING PERMITS**

Please check the Village website or call the office before starting any building project to see if a permit is needed. Permit fees will be doubled if you start a project without a permit. Please allow 10 working days to obtain permit and fees are increasing for 2020.

# **RIGHT-OF-WAY PERMIT**

The Village has recently enacted a right-of-way permit for any work being done in the right of way. If you are unsure if a permit is needed please call first! You can obtain this form on the website or at the Village Office and the fee is \$150 for most work.

# **GARBAGE/RECYCLING REMINDERS**

Garbage and recycling pick up is every Friday. Items MUST be out by 7 a.m. to ensure collection. Items placed out late will NOT be picked up. Questions on what is recyclable? Stop in and pick up a flyer.

Please place garbage and recycling bags/containers on a flat surface and **NOT** in the snow banks. During extreme weather conditions, pick-up times may be adjusted. Items frozen to the ground cannot be picked up.

Would you like to see the Village move to supplied garbage and recycle carts? This will be a referendum question on the April ballot. Informational meetings will be held early next year. Please vote if you would like to see this change take place.

Need help this winter making your payment? Call Judie @ Energy Services 608-742-4088 for heating assistance or for more information.

Winter moratorium is November 1 – April 15th; during this period, we will not disconnect electric service and you must pay your water/sewer charges monthly to be eligible for a payment agreement after the moratorium.

Please note that payments received after the due date will **NOT** be reflected on the bill that is being sent for the current month.
