Type 1 Square Tabs

On the 4th August 1987 the Post Office introduced the new style 'Window Books'. Each contains a miniature style pane of stamps with selvedge on all four sides, so there is no possibility of trimmed perforations occuring. The stamps are stuck into a red and yellow laminated cover, which also includes a 'Window' designed to show one of the stamps contained inside. Five different values exist, but there are two different bar codes for each value which are also lettered A - J on the outside cover. The first printing (Type 1) has a square tab to secure the book in the closed position.
