## **Nancy Mahoney**

Author, teacher, and fabric designer Nancy Mahoney whose quilts have been featured in many books and in over 250 national and international quilt magazines will be the guest speaker at the February meeting of the Quilt Guild of East Texas. She has authored 14 books, created over 100 free quilt patterns and designed 15 fabric collections. Nancy will present a Scrap Quilts Trunk Show. In this informal and light-hearted presentation, Nancy will share more than 40 scrap quilts including vintage quilts from her collection. Hear how her love of vintage quilts has influenced her approach to quilting. Nancy will share tips for making stunning scrap quilts and expanding your thoughts about making scrap quilts.

So, for those of you who were at the workshop on Friday, get out your EQ and practice before the meeting so you can ask her your question!

### MINUTES OF MEETING

Susan Webber said The Hive will meet today 30 minutes after the program ends. They will be finishing up the current project with sleeve, binding and label. Lynne Trigleth our librarian will share about the library. The Hive will not meet again until April.

Susan reminded everyone that all reports or advertisements for the newsletter should be transmitted to Sue Bugg by the 20<sup>th</sup> of the month. If you have any little projects for making things you can also submit those to Sue to be placed in the newsletter.

Nancy Glass announced that Jennifer Rapacki, from Boulder, CO. is here for today's program on Creativity Unleashed and How to use EQ8 design software. In February Nancy Mahoney will be here. Nancy Mahoney is a highly published world class internationally known quilter. She has juried shows as well as had winning quilts in shows. Nancy's sample quilt is on display today. Her workshop will be showing us how to do invisible machine applique. To date we only have six signed up for the workshop which is certainly not enough for this great opportunity to be instructed by someone of Nancy's caliber. Please support the Guild and sign up. Charlotte Ward will stay after the meeting to give you an opportunity. Nancy Glass mentioned that in April we have the Featherweight workshop. We have 20 signed up for tomorrow's workshop with Jennifer which is wonderful. Thank you!

Marylou Douglas announced that we have 172 members as of today. The pictorial directory is being resurrected. Marylou is in the process of getting pictures from new members. It will be emailed to member in PDF format when updated. It can be saved to your computer. This is a great way of recognizing new people you meet at the Guild.

They encouraged us to mail postcards to friends and family asking them to attend the show which is March 27 through March 28 from 9:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Challenge Block forms need to be turned in next month for a drawing of fabric. The block doesn't have to be turned in until the March Guild meeting. The Deborah Boschert designs created from her workshop held here last year need to be turned in by next meeting. Jerriann Massey is creating a special hanging for them. Special Exhibit entries need to be turned in next month. The Raffle Quilt is currently being displayed at Options Quilt Store in Jacksonville. Signup sheets for the many jobs needing to be filled in order to put on the show are out today including the food listings needed for vendors and workers. Please help us and fill all those spots. Country store is taking donations in the Boy Scout room across the parking lot at 9:00 a.m. before Guild meeting and after meeting from now through the March Guild meeting. Workers are there to sort and price items. More donations are needed including small boutique items. Cathy Woodson showed an example of a little item that is a caddy for your sewing tools. 
There will be no Hive meeting in March because we will be preparing for the Quilt Show.



## 2020 Quilt Show News

The Quilt Show is fast approaching. We need all Guild members help to make this a successful show. Below is some information you need to know:

### Quilt Entries:

Quilt Entries are due by the February 13<sup>th</sup> Guild meeting. Members may enter 5 quilts. As of the January meeting we have around 62 quilt entries. We would like to have at least 200 hundred quilts in Hall 1. If you don't want a quilt to be judged, indicate that on your entry form. Entries can be mailed to Tana Doss (address in the Guild Directory).

### Challenge Blocks:

Challenge Block entries are due at the February 13<sup>th</sup> Guild meeting. Turn entries in to Cory Starkey at the table in the foyer. If you want your block back, indicate that on the entry form. It will be given to you at the April Guild meeting.

All challenge blocks are due at the March Guild meeting and will be turned in to Cory. Be sure your name is on the block. **They will not go through intake as I said at the Guild meeting.** If you turn your block in by the March Guild meeting you will be entered in the drawing for more of the background fabric.

All blocks not being returned will be packaged for a drawing at the April Guild meeting. Your name will automatically be in the drawing if you turned in your block for the show.

### Special Exhibit:

Entries are due at the February 13<sup>th</sup> Guild meeting. Please write special exhibit on the entry form. Special Exhibit pieces will be picked up after the show at quilt distribution.

### Volunteers:

Volunteer sign-up will continue through the March Guild meeting. Most jobs during the show are sitting at a table. It is ideal to have two people per shift. White glove is a standing job, so shifts are one hour.

The Chatty Stitchers Bee is unable to oversee the kitchen on Friday as they usually do. Rose Wilson and Sheryl Moore are in need of kitchen help both days. Saturday is critical for having help cleaning up.

### I FOUND A QUILTED HEART



### QGET PROGRAMS AND WORKSHOPS

QGET is proud to be able to provide Tyler quilters with programs and workshops taught by many nationally renowned quilters. Our speakers are authors, quilt pattern designers, fabric dyers and nationally recognized instructors. Many have produced award winning quilts at some of the most prestigious quilt shows in the United States.

Programs are offered the second Thursday of each month following the QGET business meeting at First Christian Church, Tyler. There is no charge to attend a program. The business meeting begins at 10am and the Program generally starts around 11. Programs last 1-1.5 hours.

Workshops vary in length from 1/2 day to a full day. They are held on the second Friday of the month. Workshops are generally \$40 for members who sign up early and \$45 for members who sign up at the meeting the day before the workshop. Cost may vary with the length of the workshop. Workshops begin at 9am. Participants are encouraged to arrive by 8:30 to set up machines and supplies if necessary. Workshops are in the conference room at First Christian Church, Tyler. This room is located in the building behind the main sanctuary building. It is next to the scout room by the doors that lead out into the parking lot between the two buildings. Please note that these doors lock automatically and you may have to go around to the main entrance to this building to get in. When we have full day workshops, you are responsible for your lunch. You may bring a lunch or order from one of the restaurants close by.

## Price list – Country Store (2020)

Magazines – Do not need to be pre-priced. Will be 5/ \$1.00 or .25 each.

Books - Do not need to be pre-priced. \$2.00-\$5.00

Scrap bags - Do not need to pre-price. Must be usable sized scraps, not trimmings.

Fill gallon bags. They will be put in a bin priced at \$1.00-\$3.00.

DVD's- newer \$5.00, older \$2.00; CD's - \$1.00 for older and \$2.00 or \$3.00 for newer

Patterns – old clothing patterns - .50 - Old Quilt Patterns \$1.00 - Current Quilt Patterns from well-known designers - \$2.00 - \$10.00 (Example – small Buttermilk Basin pattern - \$2.00, Crabapple Hill, Red Crinoline - \$5.00, Erica DeJong pattern – \$10.00, patterns with templates (like Marti Michell) or paper for piecing - \$10.00 (like Niemeyer)

Layer Cakes and Jelly Rolls - \$15.00

Fabric – NEW INSTRUCTIONS - Measure yardage. Roll fabric and put masking around the roll and mark yardage on the tape. We will price it for you! \$1.00 - \$3.00/yard based on age & quality.

Sewing Notions –

- Small packages of lace and/or store-bought bias binding – do not pre-price, just rubber band together. Will be put in a container at 5/\$1.00
- Decorator fringe and large bolts of lace - \$2.00 to \$4.00. Depends on how much is on the bolt. Use your own judgement. Put in gallon bag and mark or if it is on the bolt or roll mark on that.
- Small notions – seam rippers, embroidery scissors, tape measures, pins, needles etc. .50- \$3.00
- Quilt rulers - \$2.00 to \$9.00- If ruler is like new mark it higher. Use your own judgement.

Hand Quilting Frames - \$5.00 - \$25.00

Batting - .50 - \$5.00 –Bundle pieces large enough to be sewn together for use and price with painter's tape. Regular quilt sizes should be priced higher.

Quilt tops - \$ 3.00 - \$25.00 – Depends how large it is, quality and age. Use your own judgement.

Quilt Blocks - \$1.00 - \$10.00 – Put in gallon bag and mark price on bag with how many blocks included. Price should reflect number of blocks. (Child's quilt or enough to piece a queen or king?)

New items - .50 – \$25.00

**Items made for the County Store by Guild members should be priced based on complexity.**

**If we don't sell it, it will be donated. Price it to sell! *Boutique items will be returned to maker if name and list of items is provided.***

**Items must be clean and saleable! No dirt, pet hair, cobwebs, etc. Country Store is not a garage sale. Quilting/sewing items only! No cookbooks, gardening books, home decor, etc. All money made at the Country Store goes to the Guild and pays for our guest speakers. We all derive great benefit from the funds raised!**



## February 2020 - QGETX Guild Library - Library Corner

===== YOUR QUILT GUILD LIBRARY =====

It is a new year, we have new Quilt Guild members, and we have had new endeavors in the Guild Library the last year, so it seems like a good time to review how the free Guild Library works for members.

**WHERE** is the Guild Library: It is located in the Christian Life Center (behind the First Christian Church building) in Room 4 and is open from 9:00 to 9:30 am on Guild meeting days.

**WHAT** is in the library: There are approximately 700 books dealing with quilt-related topics that are available for members to check out (one or more). You may return them when you are finished using them – no fines are assessed (if someone wants one you have, you will be asked if you still need it).

**FIND** a book you want: Lists of all the books in the Library are on the Quilt Guild's Website, [qgetx.org](http://qgetx.org). To locate the lists, select the tab RESOURCES (between Programs and Quilt Show on the homepage heading) and then select LIBRARY. Complete instructions for finding the lists and a book are shown on that page as well as the names of the lists. One list is the *Complete Inventory of Books* and the others are the inventory separated by category: *Applique & Embroidery*, *Art & Inspiration*, *Guides & Techniques*, *History of Quilting*, *Patchwork & Piecing*, *Seasonal Quilts*, and *Small Quilts*.

**HOLD** a book you want: If you see a book(s) on the website you would like to check out or would like to see books on a certain subject, simply email the librarian (at the bottom of this article or from the Library page on the website). The books will be held for you or located as soon as possible, if already checked out.

**BROWSE** a selection of books: Each month before the meeting from 9:30 to 10:00, a small group of books will be displayed on a round Library Table in the church foyer. If you see a book you want, simply write your name on the card in the book's envelope and put it in the file box, if a volunteer is not there. The Library Table will have a box in which to return books, as well.

**DONATE** a book: When you are next cleaning your sewing area and you find a book you are no longer using, we will gladly accept it so that other members can enjoy it.


