

Fellow Voyageurs,

I realize it is still three months away, but it definitely merits a mention: Spring Cheminot. The turnout at our Grand du Michigan events has been underwhelming. I have attempted to get the word out to every Voiture Locale by emailing the Official Call to each Chef de Gare and Correspondant Locale for whom I have a valid email. I also send the Official Call to each of the aforementioned via USPS. I also have compiled an email list based on the information Nationale provides in the Grand du Michigan membership roster.

I post the Official Call on our website and on the Grand du Michigan Facebook page. A quick browse through the membership document indicates we have approximately 750 Voyageurs. If I were to mail each one listed it would put Grand du Michigan out \$412.50 in postage alone since we no longer have a bulk mailing rate, but even then it would cost \$127 in postage alone, not to mention the paper, ink and envelopes.

I understand many of you don't use computers and don't have access to the online resources. But it is the responsibility of the Locale officers to keep their members informed, even if it means calling Voyageurs and passing on the information. Perhaps if the word were spread we would have more than 27 in attendance, as was the case for Fall Cheminot. That's 3.6% of our total membership, and that's just unacceptable.

Delta College recently received a generous donation to establish a new scholarship endowment.

The Saginaw Forty & Eight organization will proudly carry on its legacy of providing financial support to students pursuing a nursing degree. The Forty & Eight was founded nationally in 1920 by American veterans returning home from World War I in France. Originally an arm of The American Legion, the Forty & Eight became an independent and separately incorporated veterans organization in 1960.

The title of their organizations comes from the box cars used to transport

troops to the front in France during World War I. The cargo capacity sign "40 Hommes/8 Chevaux" was written on each box car that carried American doughboys to the front. Each car could hold 40 men or eight horses - known as forty-and-eights that the troops considered a miserable travel method.

At a recent meeting of the Saginaw group only six of their 18 members were in attendance, discussing how to respectfully wind down the group and leave a legacy. They donated their "street legal" train engine, involved in parades for decades, to the Great Lake Loons. During the meeting they voted to donate much of their funds to Delta College and Saginaw Valley State University to support nursing. The Saginaw Forty & Eight members are proud of their years of fundraising (primarily through community bingo

games in Saginaw Township), their ability to support Saginaw Township Little League teams and their prior support of individual nursing students. But, as with many other social organizations of decades past, they have struggled to gain and retain members. The Saginaw group's membership reached a high point of 105 over the decades, but now includes just 18 members.

Nationally, Forty & Eight has been committed to charitable and patriotic aims, including our nation's health, by fostering a nurses' training program for nearly 70 years. Delta College is proud to partner with the local Saginaw Forty & Eight group to honor their contributions and build a legacy that will last long into the future.
