

Tech Talk #115: Benefits...Do You Know the Ones You Have (part 2)

Are Benefits Required?

Most benefits are offered voluntarily by the company as a value-added service to the employee. Such voluntary benefits include retirement plans and health insurance. The government does reward companies for offering these benefits by giving favorable tax treatment to the employer and employees (i.e. insurance payments are pre-tax). Other benefits, such as Social Security, workers' compensation, and family and medical leave, are required by federal or state law.

What are the Statistics Regarding Benefits?

According to U.S. Department of Labor statistics (Bureau of Labor Statistics, or BLS), 62% of private establishments offered health insurance to their workers in March 2006. About 50% of the private establishments offered retirement plans of at least one type.

Most employees covered by medical plans were in plans requiring employee contributions for both single and family coverage. Contributions averaged \$296.88 per month for family (up from \$273 in 2005), and \$76.05 per month for single coverage (I don't know where the US BLS got their information but they are extremely low in my book)! In addition, the US BLS shows that only 52% of the workers had access to life insurance. What Should I Ask about Company Benefits?

The time to ask about benefits is "before" accepting or starting a job. Benefits are just as important, if not more so, than a regular salary. However, the questions shouldn't be asked during the interview... wait until you have been offered the job to tackle these weighty issues!

The following are some questions to keep in mind when accepting a position, or to look up in your employee handbook:

- Does the company offer health insurance, how much will I have to pay, is the premium automatically deducted, how much is the deductible, what type of plans are available, does this include dental, and vision, etc.?
- When does insurance coverage begin, are there any restrictions...some have no major medical for the first year.
- What vacation time is there, is it accrued, does it rollover at year end, can I get paid for unused days at the end of the year, how many days per year employed, etc.?
- Are holidays paid, which ones, is there sick time, how much, is there personal time, etc.?
- > 401K or retirement plans available, when am I vested, how much or does the company match contributions, is the premiums automatically deducted, etc.?
 - > Education benefits? Tuition?

- ➤ Short Term Disability? Long term disability? Supplemental Life? Accidental death and dismemberment? Employee only or family options available?
 - Severance package available?
 - ➤ Etc?

These items are not all-inclusive but they are a start of things you need to know while you are employed, and before you accept that new job!

Getting Organized

OK, so it's not really a "communications" topic, but getting organized is one of those things where everyone can use a little help. A recent survey conducted by Office Depot determined that 53% of businesspeople "function in a state of 'controlled chaos." The survey also found that 34% of businesspeople state that they lose almost two hours every week to lost productivity caused by a lack of organization. Here are some tips to get started on your reorganization efforts:

- Eliminate Excess Paper/Files: Do you really need it? If not, toss or delete it. (Remember to shred if necessary.)
- Create One "To Do" List: Consolidate all your tasks onto one list and prioritize them.
- File Those Piles of Paper: Create files for important papers, instead of filing everything on the top of your desk.
- Create a "Tickler" File: Purchase a filing folder with tabs by date. If there's a piece of paper you need to deal with on, say, the 15th, put the piece of paper behind the "15th" tab. Check your folder every day for reminders.
- <u>De-Clutter Your Desk</u>: Purchase holders or baskets for pens, papers, paper clips, so they're not strewn all over your desk.
- Use Storage Boxes for Older Materials: There are probably files in your nearest desk drawer that you haven't used in months (or years). Put those files in storage boxes and label them to make them easy to find later.
- Use Magazine Boxes: You probably have a stack of catalogs or magazines that you either plan to read or need to keep. Purchase some inexpensive cardboard magazine boxes at an office supply store, and keep them there.

February Meeting Summary by Kendal Langenberg


