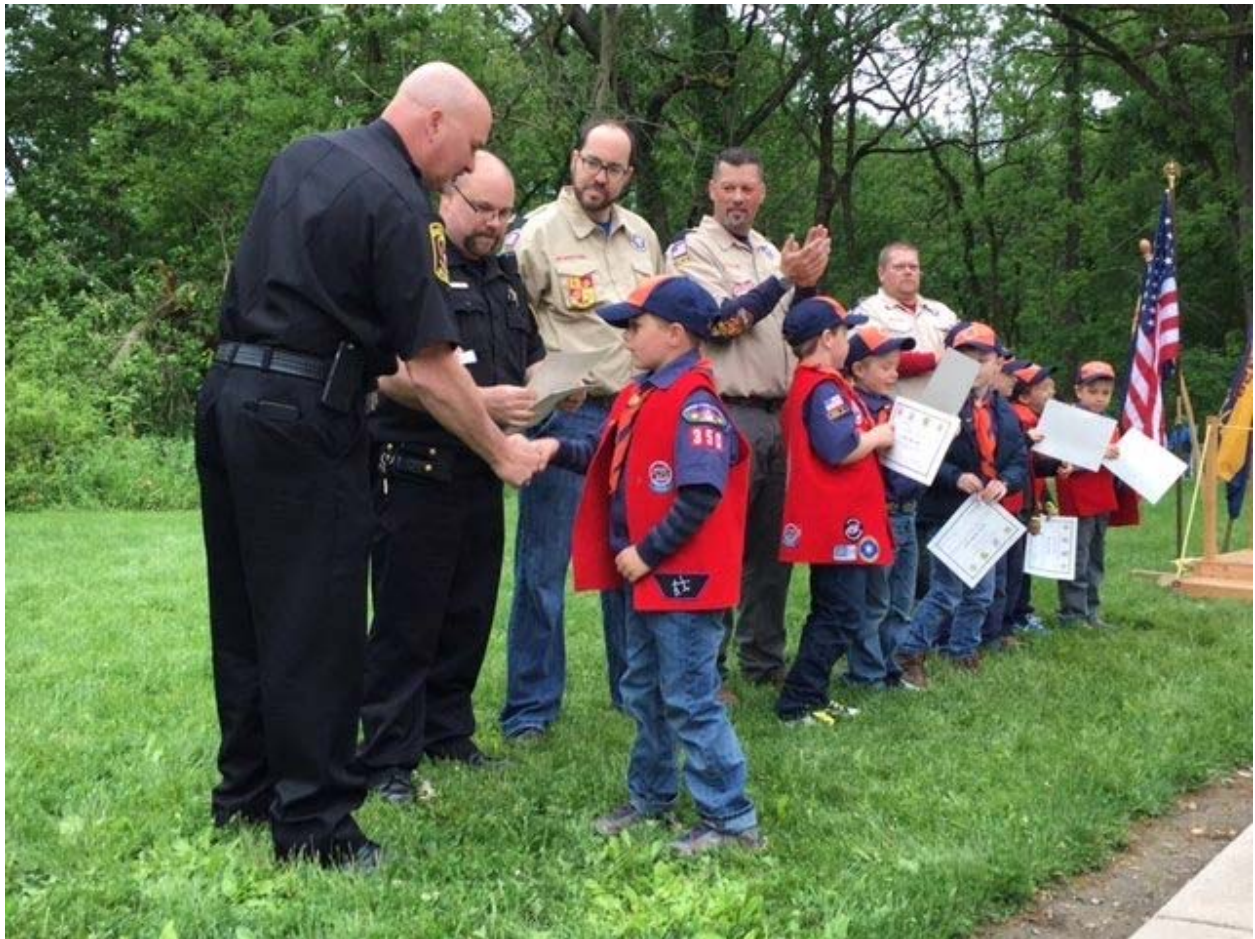


Yorkville Cub Scout Pack 350 Den 9 Tigers Graduate to Wolf Cub Scouts
