Heather Rivera, Education Specialist at the El Paso Zoo, has been working with Birds of Prey since 2010. During that time, she has worked with Golden Eagles, Harris's Hawks, Swainson's Hawks, Great Horned Owls and Burrowing Owls.

She will be discussing the work that she does at the El Paso Zoo with Birds of Prey. She will also show one of the Zoo's live education birds during this meeting.

March 21, 2022 7:00pm U.T.E.P Centennial Museum & via Zoom Birding Costa Rica's Varied Habitats Ad Konings

Costa Rica boasts a little over 900 bird species and although it is a relatively small country it has a great variety of bird habitats. Ad's trip lasted 10 days (mid to late January 2022) and covered four main habitats: high mountains (up to 10,000 ft), middle elevation (around 3-4000 ft), lower elevation Atlantic, and lower elevation Pacific side. He encountered several Resplendent Quetzals and Sunbitterns, which were on their wish list, but was also able to photograph 179 more species of birds. The best photo opportunities were always at the feeding stations of the various hotels and restaurants.

Ad Konings studies cichlid fish in Africa, cacti in the southwestern US, and birds around the world. His excellent photography has been seen in several books.

AT FEATHER LAKE

After record-breaking water depths following storms last July and August, the Feather Lake basin has been dry for 5 months now. Slowly but surely, we are removing the trash that washed in with those storms, but the task is not yet done. Fortunately, our next workday is fast approaching.

It takes place **Sat.**, **February 5**, starting at **9 a.m.** We'll be working on that trash and on removing a dead tree at the sanctuary entrance.

Feather Lake is located at 9500 North Loop at Bordeaux in El Paso, 0.3 miles west of Americas Ave.

American Bird Conservancy Bird of the Week January 28, 2022 Snowcap

At 2.5 inches long, the Snowcap is one of the of the world's smallest humming-birds — only a quarter of an inch longer than the tiny Bee Hummingbird of Cuba, generally considered to be the world's most diminutive bird. Also, the Snowcap weighs less than a penny. In fact, it is so small that it's often mistaken for a bumblebee, moth, or other large insect.

Rio Bosque's wetland cells remain fully flooded. In some years, flows to the park have ended in




early February; this year they will likely extend longer, with a briefer dry period until flows resume May 1. Avian highlights this winter have included a **White Ibis** (3rd El Paso-area record) seen Dec 27, a continuing **Lewis's Woodpecker** present since Nov 10, and a flurry of **Rusty Blackbird** sightings beginning Jan 16.
