### Immanuel updates from your Church Council~

In the here and now~ At our teleconference meeting on 3/30, the Council has decided, with the recommendation from the Bishop, to cancel services for Palm Sunday, Holy Week and Easter Sunday services. Please see the Bishop's communication at the end of this email. The Council will reevaluate our next steps on April 13th, but at this point it is sounding likely that this "stay at home" effort may continue through April. We know that we are all disappointed and concerned but as we continue to be told from our church leadership and our government health and leadership officials - the best thing we can do is stay calm, stay at home if you can, and stay safe. Your actions impact countless others as this has become increasingly clear in these days and weeks.

Wally Coughlin, our Caretaker, is continuing to clean, sanitize, and monitor the maintenance and security of the church. He is there on a regular basis so is also bringing in and securing the mail in the office. Lori Nemenz in our Admin. Office continues to work from home handling communications, picking up and responding to phone and email messages, and she is stopping into the office on Wednesdays to collect mail, process offerings and bills, make copies, etc. She can be reached either through the office phone and email or if necessary by calling her at home 833-1426. Bryan Timm, our Music Director and Carolyn Kuntz, our Sunday School Superintendent, as well as numerous others continue to share their time & talents in various ways near and far in the ongoing work of the church, for which we are thankful. We are asking that you please continue to support the church operations and your faith community at Immanuel, in any way you can, through your regular offerings mailed to the church. We also ask for your support through your unceasing prayers asking God to help and guide us all. Life and the work of the church is continuing and we ask that you please continue your support of Immanuel as you are able during this challenging time.

**Looking ahead with hope**~ We are planning an Easter Celebration the first Sunday when services resume. What a joyful reunion that will be. In the meantime we have various online resources being shared via email and Facebook and have the new "Word In Season" daily reflection booklet and "Living Lutheran" publications on the table right outside the office - feel free to pick one up if you stop at the church on Tuesday evening or request that one be delivered to you by one of our willing volunteers.

#### LETTER FROM BISHOP LOZANO:

March 25, 2020

Dear Synod, I write these next words with great sorrow, but also with a desire to protect each and every one of you. I, along with our Synod Council, recommend and urge all congregations to not gather in your churches for Palm Sunday, Holy Week and Easter Sunday liturgies. The COVID-19 pandemic has yet to reach its peak. Each day brings new numbers of individuals who have contracted the virus. These numbers still outpace those recovering. As you know, our federal, state, county and local governments are requesting and legislating the closure of businesses and institutions as well as requesting/requiring us to stay home or shelter in place. As I write these words, Governor Wolf has ordered schools to remain closed until April 9, 2020. You will also note, I am urging you not to gather in your churches.

The creative Spirit is blowing across our ELCA and our Synod. There are many new opportunities in our synod for on-line worship. And we are working to collect those opportunities and post them on our synod webpage (<a href="mailto:nwpaelca.org">nwpaelca.org</a>) and Face Book page. I understand there are congregations finding ways of meeting without gathering in large numbers in parking lots, fields and other open spaces. These ideas will also be posted on our webpage as we become aware of them. Our Synod Council will be working with their Cluster congregations to find ways of supporting one another during these days. Please reach out to your Synod Council representative. Using our synod Zoom account, our Synod Staff and Executive Committee is meeting weekly and our Synod Council has agreed to meet every other week. And I am available via email (<a href="mailto:bishop@nwpaelca.org">bishop@nwpaelca.org</a>), cell (724-931-4848) or text message. Our Synod Council and I have agreed that our stewardship priority is you. You are the body of Christ made visible in our world. Your actions speak to your communities. Your work takes first place, your mission support to our Synod and the ELCA comes second. Be Easter people for the sake of the world around you. The harvest is plentiful, the workers are few.

Finally, dear Synod, I am amazed at how you represent Christ in your communities during this troublesome time. The stories I am reading, and hearing are heartwarming and make me proud and humbled to be called your bishop. Take care of yourselves – physically, mentally, socially and above all spiritually. I and your synod council are blessed by you!

Dear Fellow Pennsylvanian,

These are unprecedented times, and we hope you and your families are staying safe. We are writing with IMPORTANT news about recent changes to the Pennsylvania primary election related to COVID 19. In order to protect the health and safety of all voters, poll workers, and election officials while also ensuring access to voting, the legislature, Governor Wolf, and the Department of State worked together to pass legislation to reschedule the PA primary election to Tuesday, June 2.

Additionally, thanks to historic legislation passed last fall, ALL Pennsylvania voters now also have the ability to <u>vote by mail</u> without having to provide an excuse - for any reason or no reason at all. You can <u>apply for mailin ballots online</u>, by mail, or in person, until one week before the election. For the 2020 primary, mail-in ballot applications **must be received by your county election office by 5 p.m. Tuesday, May 26**. Applying online is very easy and quick, and even better, if you enter your email address, you will receive notifications as to the status of your application and ballot along the way. **Once you receive your mail-in ballot, you now have until 8pm on June 2 to deliver your completed ballot to your county election office**, but you should drop it off or mail it **as early as you can** to ensure it is delivered by that time.

Voters who have already requested a mail-in or absentee ballot will receive your ballot for the rescheduled primary. There is no need to apply again if you have already done so.

Other important election-related deadlines will change along with the new primary date. The **new deadline** to <u>update your voter registration</u> is **Monday**, **May 18.** Please visit <u>www.register.votespa.com</u> to update your registration today.

Thank you for your patience and understanding as we navigate these changes. The Department of State is committed to keeping voters informed. To stay up-to-date with the latest and most accurate election information in Pennsylvania, visit <u>votesPA.com</u>, or contact your <u>county election office</u>.


