Please turn to face the cross at the entrance of the sanctuary. As broken children, we begin worship by acknowledging our sinfulness and asking for God's forgiveness.

Silence for reflection and self-examination.

To you, O God, we lift up our souls.
You know us through and through; we confess our sins to you.

7Then I said, 'See, God, I have come to do your will, O God' (in the scroll of the book it is written of me)."




DISTRIBUTION OF COMMUNION






