In addition, we have a radio program on 102.1 FM that airs each weekday around 12:15.

We are a Bible centered, mission minded, and family oriented church. We hope you will enjoy our fellowship. Thank you for coming, and please return at every opportunity.

Tidings from Timothy

We are in a time of transition here at Willette. There is a great challenge before us that will require "all hands on deck." These hands will need to be hands of service. This morning's lesson is about service and how we can coordinate with our deacons going forward to make Willette better than it has ever been! We expand on that tonight with a lesson about using our talents entitled "such as I have."

<u>Ladies:</u> Today, the ladies will be making (and eating at least some of them), cookies for various people after church today in the fellowship hall.

Transportation Ministry: We are getting some volunteers now for this ministry. Thank you so much! I will compile some addresses and we will go from there. I could still use some more people on the list. You will not be called on with any frequency, but sometimes Connie and I or the Andersons may have a problem with providing the transportation, and we will give you a ring. Once again, this is for those who can't or don't qualify to ride the van (very young children or people who can't get in a van).

<u>Fish Fry:</u> This will be on May 11th. I have been announcing this for so long that I am beyond hungry. When will it ever get here?? Maybe we can hasten things along if we give any donation toward it to Randy Allen.

<u>Lull in Activity:</u> We are experiencing a little lull in things right now until the summer stuff gets cranked up. We do have a graduation celebration on the 12th after evening service.

Understandest thou what thou singest?

Paul indicated that we should sing both with the spirit and understanding as we praise God and His Son (I Corinthians 14:15). The context of this passage shows that

some were singing in a language not understood by others, hence they could not sing with understanding. Sometimes we sing words that may as will be in a foreign tongue for all of the understanding we have of their meaning. Such misunderstandings are caused by several factors, including figures of speech, archaic terminology, terms that are not archaic, but are seldom used, failure to properly read a word and ignorance of Bible teaching alluded to in a song. Hopefully, the following will help us better understand what we are singing.

In the song, "Higher Ground," we sing of "heaven's tableland." This refers to a broad, level area, such as a plateau, which will be above this world and all its cares and trials.

In the song, "It Came Upon The Midnight Clear," the second verse speaks of "cloven skies," which does not refer to a spicy aroma, but to skies that are opened up and separated.

In "The Great Physician," we sing of the "seraph song." "Seraph" is an abbreviated term for "seraphim," high ranking angels (Isa. 6:2,6).

When we sing the "Rose Of Sharon," we are not singing of a girl who has a thorny-stemmed flower. Sharon is the name of the plain along the Mediterranean Seacoast stretching from Mt. Carmel northward and to Joppa southward. "Jesus, Rose Of Sharon," is based upon the statement in Song of Solomon 2:1. "I am the rose of Sharon, and the lily of the valleys." It is intended to figuratively convey the attractiveness of Christ.

If you shout and sing "Hosannas" to Christ, just what are you doing ("Just Over In The Glory Land")? "Hosanna" is actually a Greek word spelled in English letters (transliterated), meaning, "Save, We Pray!" It was the cry of acclamation that went up from the multitudes that accompanied the Lord into Jerusalem at His "Triumphal Entry" (Matthew 21:9)
