

Summer Worship at FBC

Worship during Pastor Dave's sabbatical will feature a variety of voices from our congregation and beyond. We think it is an exciting lineup! Here are our guest preachers and special services this summer.

Randall O'Brien will be preaching on May 1, June 5, and July 3. Randall is an ordained minister and retired religion professor and university administrator who served as provost at Baylor and most recently president at Carson-Newman University in Tennessee. Randall is a Vietnam veteran. Kay and Randall joined our church on the last Sunday before the pandemic shutdown. At FBC. Randall serves as a deacon. We are very thankful that he and Kay have five grandchildren in Ames, because they helped lure them to town!





Our deacons will be leading our service on May 8, featuring lots of great music by Kent Johnson. Kent is a Senior Financial Coach at the Evelyn K. Davis Center for Working Families at DMACC and manages the Consumer Credit Counseling Service in Rochester, MN. When he is not deaconing at FBC, you can find Kent playing in the local band Vinyl Vagabonds.

Jeanne Bishop will be our guest preacher on May 15. She is a Cook County public defender and member of Second Presbyterian Church in Chicago with a powerful personal story of forgiveness. Jeanne is a human rights advocate, writer, speaker, teacher and mom. Since the 1990 murders of her sister, brotherin-law, and their unborn baby, she has advocated for forgiveness and reconciliation, violence prevention and reform of the criminal justice system to make it more merciful.

Jim Hinds will be our preacher on May 29. Jim and Ann are well known to many of us (Ann is the daughter of Harris and Katy Seidel). He eventually went to seminary and served as an ABC pastor in Massachusetts. After Jim's retirement, he and Ann moved to Keene, New Hampshire shortly before the pandemic began. Phyllis Schrag will be our guest preacher on June 12 and July 17. Phyllis is a retired public-school speech, theatre, English and gifted education teacher. 

Update from Linda and Bruce Hanson in Honduras

¡Saludos de Río Chiquito! Greetings from Río Chiquito! We have an update for you!

First, thanks so much for your past prayers and financial support. It's been quite a year and we so appreciate the support!

After meeting yesterday with the president of AIEH, the social branch of the Evangelical and Reformed Church here, we've decided to stay in Honduras through at least the end of the year. Our ministry will continue to be focused primarily on the children and youth of the community. We love them all so much!!

The church here is looking for funding to begin a twice a week feeding program for children of the community. Along with this will be story time (using the donated books we've received), homework help, simple medical care or referral, and a children's devotional. We get to buy the groceries and plan and carry out all the programming.

After the children attend we will be doing follow-up visits to their homes to assess additional needs. We know we will encounter hunger/malnutrition, lack of medical and dental care, safety issues, domestic violence/abuse, poor health literacy (who knew you didn't treat epilepsy with vitamins!) and poor quality housing. Some of these issues can be addressed through education and assistance to access medical/dental care. Others are obviously more complex.

We also hope to begin offering scholarships for children who complete 9th grade to go to high school in nearby Puerto Cortes, improving their future chances to move out of poverty.

This is a great project and we're excited to get working on it! Thanks again, Pastor Dave, for the support we've received from Ames FBC.
