I'm not sure why it's "gold lined" or even a condo, but sometimes I think it's easy for me to look beyond what is happening now and all that life throws at us, and think about life after being on earth.....

After reading a couple articles on a pastor's blog that I follow, and having a discussion with a patient about what she thinks heaven is like, and how she is joyfully anticipating being with her daughter again, I found myself driving home after work this week and rethinking my view of heaven,...

You see, Mrs. L, said "heaven is not only peaceful, perfect and joyous but also humble...."

Humble, that's what my vision of heaven is lacking-humility.

I think sometimes we find ourselves thinking about God and heaven in an earthly sense, a human sense, but in fact, heaven isn't like anything we are used to. If God can be humble and exemplify humility, why wasn't I thinking that heaven would be "simple" and peaceful?

What is Ash Wednesday?

Service will be offered at UPC • March 6, 2019 @ 7:00pm

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent and is always 46 days before Easter Sunday. Lent is a 40-day season (not counting Sundays) marked by repentance, fasting, reflection, and ultimately celebration. The 40-day period represents Christ's time of temptation in the wilderness, where he fasted and where Satan tempted him. Lent asks believers to set aside a time each year for similar fasting, marking an intentional season of focus on Christ's life, ministry, sacrifice, and resurrection.
