

1. A	Enter working trot crossing groundpole at L.		
Χ	Halt, salute; proceed working trot		
2. I C	Trot over cross rail. Track right.		
3. B	Negotiate shallow serpentine of 5 cones (spaced 6 meters apart) inside track on long side.		
V	Halt between bales and rail. Rein back 3 to 4 steps Proceed working walk back to bales		
V	Halt. Pick up object on top of hay bales. Walk to near E and deposit object on top of a second stack of hay bales		
E C	Working trot. Canter, followed immediately by circle right 20 meters.		
M - E	Change rein. Working trot near centerline.		
Α	Working walk. Release reins. Negotiate five- cone serpentine on long side on a loose rein.

Dressage Trail Course

Open to horse and ponies. Average time 3 minutes, Scheduling time 5 minutes. Horse to be judged on response to aids, relaxation and calmness. To be judged as a test of use of the aids and willingness of the horse to follow the aids. Subtle aids to be awarded; crude aids to be penalized. Prompt and willing response to the aids to be rewarded; inattentiveness, going above or below the bit, resisting the leg and unwillingness to go forward to be penalized. Horse to be on or responding to the aids.

IMPROVE YOUR ABILITY TO SIT THE TROT

THREE EXERCISES TO HELP LOOSEN YOUR HIPS.

Sitting the trot is one of the big hurdles a rider has to face when moving up the levels in dressage. While learning to sit the trot may be easy for some riders, for most it presents a perplexing set of issues. The primary problem riders encounter when tackling the sitting trot is a lack of flexibility and movement in the hips. As anyone who has tried to salsa dance may have noticed, tight hips are a common problem.

In my Pilates practice, most of the clients I have worked with—riders and nonriders alike—have this same issue. When a rider has tight hip joints, following the horse's movement in every gait is difficult. But rigid and tense hips especially impede the rider's ability to sit the trot because this requires a quick pulsing action of supple, loose hip

joints opening and gently closing in a fluid and rhythmic fashion. While it may not be obvious, following the motion of the horse's back in all gaits requires the same flexibility of the hips. But while a rider might be comfortable at the walk and canter, easily sitting the trot often feels out of reach.

In this article, I will briefly explain the mechanics of the hip joint and give you two Pilates-based exercises to help you find, isolate and loosen your hips. Practicing these exercises will help you learn how to truly follow the horse's movement at any gait.

Once your hip joints allow your thigh bones (femurs) to move freely in their sockets while you keep your pelvis and lower back stable, sitting the trot will become easy.
