Elnora Louisa (Wilson) Winkel died Sunday, July 22, 2007 in Green Acres Retirement Home in Ionia, Michigan of natural causes. Bachelor's Degree in Education. She retired from teaching in 1973. Elnora married Julius R. Winkel of Harbor Beach on August 19, 1934. They had one daughter, Barbara. Julius preceded her in death on July 15, 1995 Elnora was a member for most of her life of the First United Methodist Church where she sang in the choir. She was President of the Harbor Beach Women's Club, participated in the Huron County Historical Society, and was a member of the Huron County Chapter of the Michigan Association of Retired School Personnel. As President of the Harbor Beach Branch of the Women's National Farm and Garden Association, she instituted a scholarship program for Harbor Beach High School graduates. In 1980, she was one of the founders of The Grice House Museum in Harbor Beach. During her years as curator, she helped expand the museum to include a one-room schoolhouse and a large display of agricultural equipment. She loved to travel the world and enjoyed sewing, guilting, reading, and baking. Elnora is survived by her Son-In-Law, John Longstreth of Portland, MI; Grandson Christopher (Sharon) Longstreth of Grand Rapids, MI; Granddaughter Julie (Thomas) Tkach of Portland, MI; Greatgrandchildren Samuel and Emily Longstreth; Sister-In-Law Betty Jo Wilson; several nieces and nephews; and grandnieces and grandnephews.
