**REMEMBRANCE DAY:** On Sunday, November 11, we celebrate Remembrance Day, a time to remember those who died in the First and Second World Wars and the Korean War as well as in military operations and peacekeeping missions around the world. This year is the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the end of World War I, commonly called the “Great War” or the “war to end all wars”. We observe Remembrance Day on November 11<sup>th</sup> because it was on November 11, 1918, at 11:00 a.m. that the peace treaty ending World War I came into effect. As we remember today, let us pray for all those – military and civilian – who have suffered the horrors of war.

**RINGING OF THE CHURCH BELLS AT DUSK ON NOVEMBER 11TH:** Sunday November 11<sup>th</sup> is the 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the signing of the Armistice to end the First World War. As a way of marking this anniversary and of encouraging all Canadians to reflect on the loss of life and the sacrifices made by soldiers and their families, the Royal Canadian Legion has invited all churches and houses of worship to ring their bells at sunset on this day.

Please join with us in praying that this ringing of our church bells on November 11<sup>th</sup> may be a sign both of our remembrance of those who have suffered the horrors of war and of our desire for justice and peace for all. The ringing will begin at approximately 6 pm. Anyone interested in helping ring the bell please be at the church for this time.
