

CONCERNING THE SERVICE: Confirmation is a necessary Sacrament wherein the bishop, a direct descendant of Christ's Apostles, bestows the empowering gifts of the Holy Ghost for a life of ministry as Christ's servant. Confirmation can also be seen as an extension of Baptism, as an adult acceptance of promises, usually made by parents and godparents on behalf of an infant. Reception is a public affirmation of faith in the presence of a bishop, who receives the candidates into the Episcopal Church. Today the body of Christ is indeed built up.
