

The schedule sometimes varies; please check the bulletin or website, or request email notifications from ndworian@comcast.net.

On the first and third Sundays of the month, the Divine Liturgy is typically celebrated primarily in English. On other Sundays and Feast Days, the Liturgy is primarily in Ukrainian. Preaching is usually bilingual: English and Ukrainian.

The Nativity of Our Lord, God and Savior, Jesus Christ

For unto us a Child is born, to us a Son is given ... and His name will be called "Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace. (Isaiah 9:6)

God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, that whoever believes in Him should not perish but have eternal life. For God sent His Son into the world not to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through Him. (John 3:16-17)

PASTOR'S LETTER

Dear Friends,

It is with some reluctance that I write this Pastor's Letter for the **final issue of our Parish Bulletin**. When I first arrived at St. Michael's, the bulletin was edited by Christina Vecbastiks. The task was later taken up by Peter W. Fesz. In the last few years, the person behind our beautiful bulletin was Julie Rogers. I want to thank all of the parishioners who have worked hard to provide a weekly publication for our parishioners, with needed information and with inspirational material as well. We tend to take for granted the labors of the bulletin editor. We expect the bulletin to simply show up week after week, but it is a task that requires constant attention and weighs heavily on those who volunteer for the task.

Perhaps that is why no one has stepped forward to continue this work. The Pastoral Council has decided unanimously to discontinue the bulletin. This will save us some money on printing costs and on bulletin covers. It was decided that in this age of digital communications, better utilization of our parish website and our email list will have to take the place of our bulletin. If you are not currently receiving our parish emails, please make sure that Mrs. Nadya Dworian has your email address. We do want everyone to receive the very helpful reminders regarding the schedule and other issues. We will begin adding weekly financial reports to those emails as well. Until now they were carried in the bulletin. On occasion I may still write a Pastor's Letter and disseminate it electronically as well. Pastoral Letters from our hierarchy will also be distributed this way. Any liturgical schedule changes will be posted on the home page of our website. I encourage you to visit <u>www.stmichaeltucson.org</u> if you have not done so in the last couple of weeks, as the website

has been entirely redone. You will notice a box with a red outline on the home page. That is where schedule changes will go. That should make them easy to find.

Please note that the parish is facing some major expenses currently, since we need to replace our antiquated heating/air conditioning system, which is on its last legs. The Pastoral Council has accepted a proposal from Hamstra Air Conditioning that will cost us \$17,394.00. The Eparchy has approved this expenditure, but we need to raise the funds. So far we have a pledge of \$5000 from the Sisterhood of Sts. Mary and Martha as well as \$1500 raised in donations. That means that **we need to raise over \$11,000.00 in the next two months!** This should get everyone's attention. The new system will be much more energy efficient and it will be safer for our church from a fire safety perspective. I know that we all tend to overextend ourselves in terms of generosity as we prepare for Christmas, but please do remember this need as well.

2016 has been a memorable year. I don't think any of us will soon forget the tumultuous presidential election of 2016. It has also been a good year for us as a parish. We were finally able to complete the sale of our old parish property on Brown Avenue, and pay off the mortgage which had been a burden around our necks for seven years. The interior of our church went through a significant beautification project, with a warm wood finish replacing the exposed bricks of our walls. We are all grateful to Bohdan Gojnycz, and his assistants Ivars Vecbastiks and George Terleckyj for this labor of love (and not a little sweat). George and Lesia Terleckyj painted a series of 16 small circular icons depicting St. Michael and some of the New Martyrs of Ukraine. My own efforts to have the Sheptytsky Institute find a new home at the University of Toronto also came to fruition this year. In 2016 we saw eight children approach First Confession and Solemn Holy Communion. Our Eparchy held its first Sobor. We welcomed new parishioners, held our Vibrant Parish planning sessions and immediately began to implement some recommendations of those planning events. Our long-awaited adult Bible Study got off to a good start. We held a Vacation Bible School for our children for the first time as well. 2016 is also the year that Bishop Richard Seminack passed into eternal life. We await his successor with prayer and hope for the future. The fact that we now have a whole new crop of Altar Servers ranging from little to extra tall bodes well for our future as well. We continue to support our seminarians Martin Nagy and Carlos Batiz as they further discern their futures.

Amidst all of this we dare not forget all of the perhaps less exciting, but very important ongoing good works: the prayers, the charitable activities, the weekly parish lunches, the cleaning of the church and hall, the singing practices, the Sisterhood meetings, a hard-working Pastoral Council and a responsible Financial Council, and ongoing catechesis among them.

From Halia and myself I wish you a quietly joyful Christmas season. While the world forgets about Christmas after the last post-holiday sale, we are just beginning to celebrate the birth of our Savior, and we won't let go until February 2! In a world that keeps getting more interesting and significantly more challenging for us Christians, how good it is to know that our Lord became one of us and knows intimately all the joys and all the struggles of being human. And more importantly, he wants us to come to know intimately the very life of God. Today we shall begin singing: "Бог Предвічний народився! God from before the ages is born today!" God bless you in 2017!

The Christmas Story: The Incarnation of Our Lord Jesus Christ

As Recorded in the Gospel According to Saint Luke, Chapter 2

In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be enrolled. This was the first enrollment, when Quirinius was governor of Syria. And all went to be enrolled, each to his own city. And Joseph also went up from Galilee, from the city of Nazareth, to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, to be enrolled with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. And while they were there, the time came for her to be delivered. And she gave birth to her firstborn Son and wrapped Him in swaddling cloths, and laid Him in a manger, because there was no place for them in the inn.

And in that region there were shepherds out in the field, keeping watch over their flock by night. And an angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were filled with fear. And the angel said to them, "Be not afraid; for behold, I bring you good news of a great joy which will come to all the people; for to you is born this day in the city of David a Savior, who is Christ the Lord. And this will be a sign for you: you will find a babe wrapped in swaddling cloths and lying in a manger." And suddenly there was with the angel a multitude of the heavenly host praising God and saying,

"Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace among men with whom He is pleased!"

When the angels went away from them into Heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go over to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened, which the Lord has made known to us." And they went with haste, and found Mary and Joseph, and the Babe lying in a manger. And when they saw it they made known the saying which had been told them concerning this Child; and all who heard it wondered at what the shepherds told them. But Mary kept all these things, pondering them in her heart. And the shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen, as it had been told them.


And at the end of eight days, when He was circumcised, He was called Jesus, the name given by the angel before He was conceived in the womb.




Sunday of the Holy Forefathers, the Patriarchs






Saint Basil the Great January 1st



Theophany of Our Lord in the Jordan January 6th

O our Savior, the armies of angels trembled when they saw You baptized by your servant, and the Holy Spirit bearing witness and descending, and when they heard the voice of the Father speaking from heaven: This One upon whom the Forerunner lays his hands is my beloved Son in whom I am well pleased. O Christ our God, glory to You! 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

The Lord Has Made His Salvation Known to the Whole World
