

The 2020 Annual Meeting of the El Paso/Trans-Pecos Audubon Society promises to be a most interesting and entertaining evening. Not only will you be able to visit friends and fellow Auduboners, we will be having a great presentation by Dr. David Angerstein, who has worked with conservation organizations around the world studying a variety of wildlife. His talk will focus on his experiences in conservation and wildlife rehabilitation in Central and South America.

We will be honoring Dr. Cesar Méndez, Superintendent of the Franklin Mountains State Park for his years of working to protect the Franklin Mountains and the Park.

Dinner will be part of the evening's activities, and we have a number of delicious menu items to choose from. This year there will be two vegetarian options and two meat options.

# Beef and Chicken Fajitas (\$19 per person) - meat

Prepared with bell peppers, onions and tomatoes and served with ranchero or refried beans, Spanish rice, homemade flour tortillas, guacamole, tostadas, pico de gallo, specialty sauce and cilantro.

# Mexican Combination Platter (\$18 per person) – meat or vegetarian

<u>Meat option</u>: one chile relleno, one cheese enchilada (red or green), one flauta (beef <u>or</u> chicken), one beef gordita, refried beans, Spanish rice, tostadas, salsa

<u>Vegetarian option</u>: two chile rellenos, two cheese enchiladas (red or green), refried beans, Spanish rice, tostadas, salsa

**Important:** when choosing this option, specify whether you want the meat or the vegetarian option.

# Vegetarian Lasagna (\$16 per person)

Served with green garden tossed salad with ranch and Italian dressings, green beans almandine (without bacon) and French bread

We are excited to announce the March and April 2020 joint meetings of the **Sierra Club** and **Audubon Society**. The members of these groups have many overlapping interests about birds, nature, and conservation. However, everyone has such busy lives that we can't always attend the monthly meetings of the individual organizations. To try to allow us more opportunities to get to know each other, we are having these two joint meetings.

In March, both organizations will meet during the regularly scheduled Audubon meeting time, **Monday, March 16<sup>th</sup>, at 6:30 pm,** at the Centennial Museum on the UTEP campus. The program will be on the environmental benefits of green infrastructure, including for wildlife habitat. Rain in late November and early December, sent 2 surges of runoff into the Feather Lake basin. On Dec 10,




the water depth at the inlet hit 2.2 feet, our deepest measurement for the year. Of course, both storm events also brought the inevitable load of trash previously dumped into upstream drains.

More water will likely be available to the park this year in February and March than in prior years, thanks to favorable vol-



umes of water now in storage in upstream reservoirs. The wetland cells at Rio Bosque will likely stay fully flooded through the end of February, and irrigation water is expected to be available in mid-March. Last year's irrigation season didn't begin until June.

Unfortunately, the pages providing up-to-date information on Rio Bosque's water conditions and birds were recently eliminated from the park's website (<u>www.riobosque.org</u>); efforts to get them restored are underway. Upcoming free walking tours:
