## Perseverance

Some of you may have heard of a man named Wrongway Riggles. On New Year's Day, 1929, Georgia Tech played UCLA in the Rose Bowl. In that game, a man named Roy Riggles recovered a fumble for California. Somehow, Riggles became confused and ran 65 yards in the wrong direction. One of his teammates, Benny Lom, outdistanced him and tackled him just before he scored for the opposing team. When California attempted to punt, Tech blocked the kick and scored a safety, which was the ultimate margin of victory.

That strange play came in the first half, and everyone watching the game was asking the same question: What will Coach Nibbs Price do with Roy Riggles in the second half? The players went into the dressing room. Riggles put his blanket around his shoulders, sat down in a corner, put his face in his hands and cried like a baby.

A coach usually has a great deal to say to his team during halftime, but that day, Coach Price was quiet. Then the timekeeper came in and announced that there were only three minutes till play time. Price said simply, Men, the same team that played the first half, will start the second.

The players got up and started out - all but Riggles. He didn't budge. The coach called to him again; still he didn't move. The coach said, Roy, didn't you hear me? The same team that played the first half, will start the second. Then Riggles looked up, and Price saw that his cheeks were wet with a strong man's tears.

Coach, Riggles said, I can't do it to save my life. I've ruined you. I've ruined the University of California. I've ruined myself. I couldn't face that crowd in the stadium to save my life.

Then Price said, Roy, get up and go on back. The game is only half over. Riggles went back, and those Georgia Tech players will tell you they have never seen a man play football as Roy Riggles played in that second half.
